OVERVIEW

The 25 cabin outboard Yamaha from ALFASTREET MARINE is a compact motor yacht built on a sturdy steel hull. Driven by a single Yamaha outboard, it combines manageable proportions with comfortable accommodations for two for overnight use.

Selecting a 25 cabin outboard Yamaha

Opt for this model when you want an easy-to-handle, low-maintenance yacht that still offers overnight capability. Measuring 24 ft (7.5 m) LOA with an 8 ft (2.5 m) beam and a shallow draft of 1.64–2.297 ft (0.5–0.7 m), it is well suited to marinas and shallow coastal waterways. As a motor yacht, it provides a steady cruising pace of 8 knots with a maximum of about 12 knots, powered by a single Yamaha outboard and laid out to sleep two with one head.

Owner Experience Review

Owners and charter operators most often deploy the 25 cabin outboard Yamaha from ALFASTREET MARINE as a six-person dayboat for short lake excursions and coastal hops, a usage pattern reflected in its frequent listing on European charter sites. The cockpit is deep and social, featuring two opposing three-seat benches, a table that expands, and a sizable aft sunpad that extends to roughly 1.70 m—ideal for day cruising, though it can feel snug when fully occupied. Below deck, the compact private cabin provides a short-term sleeping option; access is narrow and headroom is limited, while the aft galley unit (sink, optional stove, fridge drawer) suits day trips but offers minimal storage for extended voyages.

Underway, the conservative hull shape and twin trim flaps promote safe, steady handling, complemented by high bulwarks and clear sightlines from the helm for a reassuring feel. Typical power packages center on 250–300 hp Yamaha or Mercury outboards, with some dealer-specified builds showing

modest top speeds—emphasizing fuel efficiency and onboard comfort over high speed. Maintenance follows normal outboard service schedules, and while owner commentary tends to be largely positive, buyers should note the brand’s boutique status and prepare to source parts and service through regional dealers or distributors.

Pros and Cons

- Versatile “Swiss Army knife” dayboat profile that performs well for family cruising, charter work, and brief overnighting.
- Deep, sheltered cockpit with face-to-face seating, an extendable table, and a large aft sunpad that encourages social use.
- Predictable, secure handling aided by trim flaps, high bulwarks, and good visibility from the helm.
- Some outboard setups produce modest top speeds, prioritizing efficiency and comfort rather than outright performance.
- Cabin entry is confined with limited standing headroom, making it best suited to short stays rather than extended liveaboard use.
- A limited global dealer network may necessitate routing parts and service through regional distributors.

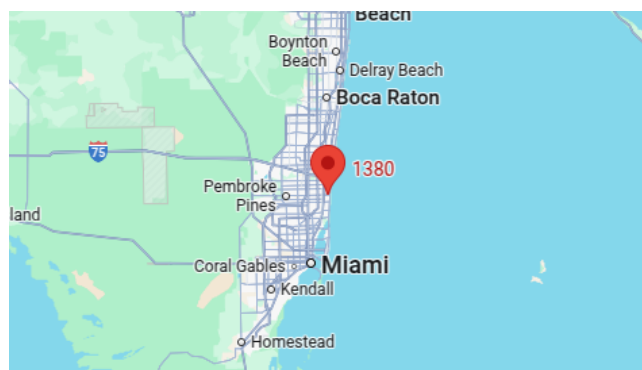
