The 37 XC Cross Cabin Brabus from Axopar is a modern motor yacht designed for owners who prioritize confident proportions, practical onboard comfort, and uncomplicated performance. Offered by Andrey Shestakov and Shestakov Yacht Sales, this model combines appreciable size, dependable power, and straightforward systems for flexible days afloat.

Selecting a 37 XC Cross Cabin Brabus

With a 37 ft LOA and an 11 ft beam, it establishes a stable platform for day cruising and relaxed weekend adventures, and includes the convenience of an onboard head. As a well-honed motor yacht, it projects a go-anywhere attitude while retaining the ease of serviceability associated with outboard propulsion.

Owner Experience Review

Owners typically employ the 37 XC Cross Cabin Brabus from Axopar for family outings and short overnight trips, often accommodating four when fitted with the optional aft cabin. The enclosed wheelhouse, expansive side doors, and ergonomically arranged helm and galley create a genuinely all-weather weekender, while the deck configuration and cockpit seating are tuned for social day use and entertaining. Some owners also report it being suitable for light demo or charter roles because of its adaptable layout.

Underway, the planing hull offers lively acceleration, with owner reports and tests recording top speeds in the vicinity of 48 knots when equipped with twin outboards. Compared with the smaller 28, many owners find the 37 to be more composed in choppy conditions, and installations using twin Mercury Verado 300s receive praise for robust mid-range torque on coastal passages—assuming manufacturer recommended servicing is observed.

Comfort aboard is regarded as solid for short cruises and overnight stays, with a forward cabin plus an aft-cabin option giving practical sleeping spaces for four. The Brabus Line finish is admired by some for its premium appearance, while other owners consider the extra features disproportionately expensive for their benefit. Routine ownership commentary focuses on maintenance: the Verado 300s require 100/300-hour service intervals and are more complex than smaller outboards, so dealer servicing is common; documented access via the aft area and transom to batteries, steering, and primary systems helps keep routine tasks like anode checks and lower-unit inspections manageable.

Pros and Cons

- Versatile weekender that can sleep four with the aft-cabin option and works well for day boating and entertaining.

- All weather wheelhouse with large doors and well sorted helm/galley ergonomics provides real shelter and usability.
- Sporty performance with twin outboards; owners and tests report brisk acceleration and near 48 knot top speeds, with a more settled ride than the 28.
- Brabus Line trim and extras are polarizing, with some owners calling them extremely pricey for what you get.
- Twin Mercury Verado 300s carry higher service complexity and 100/300 hour intervals, so dealer servicing and costs need planning.
- Best suited to short cruises and overnights rather than extended stays, as the layout prioritizes weekendng.
