Measuring 28 ft (8.53 m) LOA with an 8 ft (2.56 m) beam, this center-console platform is often trailerable depending on local regulations while still offering true walk around access for fishing. A single Yamaha outboard powered by gas keeps the propulsion simple and economical, and the fiberglass and plastic construction emphasizes longevity and low upkeep. ## Owner Experience Review

---

Owners commonly describe the 2550 from BLUEWATER SPORTFISHING as an honest offshore day boat capable of comfortable runs in the 50–100+ mile range to productive tuna grounds, while remaining versatile enough for family cruises and island hops on weekends. Many owners trailer the boat; despite an overall length near 28 feet when including the bracket, the model is promoted in the 25 foot category, and owners report it tows and stows more easily than numerous 27–28 foot rivals.

On the water, the 24° deadrise at the transom is credited with a ride that owners and dealers consistently call flat, composed, and confidence building—some even claim it’s the best riding center console they’ve experienced. Reported cruise speeds typically sit around 26–28 knots, with wide open throttle numbers into the low 40s when fitted with twin 200s; many owners, however, emphasize the importance of selecting and tuning props to achieve the desired RPM band. Actual dryness varies by conditions: several owners praise a notably dry ride, while others find the forward area can be wet at times and suggest installing curtains.

The fit and finish favor fishing utility: a centerline 480 qt fishbox, multiple insulated boxes, and a 7' rod locker underline its angling focus. Living accommodations are intentionally minimal, but the finished console—with the option for a head and an insulated cooler beneath the console seat—provides welcome comfort for day trips. Some owners caution that bow bench seating arrangements can encroach on fighting space. Maintenance reports are

generally favorable, helped by the absence of wood in the bonded “Multi Plex” stringer system and the foam cored transom. Owners frequently undertake DIY improvements—dash and panel upgrades, curtain additions, and console refinements—and many forum threads commend the factory’s responsiveness. Typical upkeep topics include regular outboard service, prop tuning, and occasional electrical or alarm troubleshooting.

## Pros and Cons

- Offshore capable day boat used by owners for 50–100+ mile runs.
- Smooth, confident ride from the 24° deadrise that feels bigger than its class.
- Trailerable footprint (marketed 25' class, ~28' with bracket) eases towing and storage.
- Forward area can be wet in certain conditions without curtains.
- Bow bench layouts may reduce room to fight fish.
- Performance often depends on careful prop selection and RPM tuning.
