OVERVIEW

The 350 Realm from Boston Whaler marries robust offshore capability with a focus on onboard comfort. Classified as a motor yacht in the cruiser segment, it rides on a durable fiberglass and plastic hull, uses a triple outboard propulsion layout, and carries the tankage and amenities intended for long days afloat.

Selecting a 350 Realm

Opt for the 350 Realm if you need a high quality motor yacht that aligns with a cruiser lifestyle. Fitted with triple Mercury outboards specified by Boston Whaler, and measuring 35 ft (10.82 m) overall with a 10 ft (3.3 m) beam, it's designed to handle family outings, social cruising, and confident coastal passages.

- Triple-engine setup: 3 Mercury outboards delivering strong thrust and agile handling
- Fuel type: Gas/Petrol; configured for outboard efficiency and straightforward servicing
- Measured capability: LOA 35 ft (10.82 m), beam 10 ft (3.3 m), draft 6.835 ft (2.0833 m)
- Durable structure: fiberglass and plastic hull with a fiberglass deck
- Comfort on board: 1 enclosed head; freshwater capacity of 45 gal for day-long use
- Range-ready tanks: 385 gal fuel capacity supports extended cruising plans

Questions and Answers

Q: What powers the 350 Realm? A: It is equipped with three Mercury outboards, combining **triple engines**, **Outboard** configuration, and **Gas/Petrol** fueling for confident performance.

Q: How large is the boat? A: The 350 Realm measures **LOA 35 ft (10.82 m)** with

a **beam of 10 ft (3.3 m)** , balancing stability and maneuverability.

Q: What is the draft? A: The minimum draft is **6.835 ft (2.0833 m)** , supporting a mix of cruising scenarios.

Q: How is it classified and what is the hull made of? A: It's a motor yacht aligned with the cruiser class, built on a **fiberglass and plastic** hull with a fiberglass deck.

Q: What onboard capacities support longer outings? A: You get **fuel capacity of 385 gal , fresh water of 45 gal , and 1 head** , well-suited for day cruising and entertaining.

Owner Experience Review

Owners and reviewers frequently describe the 350 Realm by Boston Whaler as a versatile crossover that moves easily between family day trips, weekenders, and offshore angling. On the water, commentary often highlights a composed, stable ride and a deep V hull with 23° of transom deadrise that softens chop; in 2–3' swells one test observed “no pounding and she just skipped across from one wave to the next.” That combination of steadiness and control is a common note in feedback from owners and brokers.

Inside, the deck plan accommodates upfront socializing, a protected helm beneath the hardtop, and a genuine cabin with galley and head that converts the boat into a comfortable weekender. Reviews point to an airy feel, ample lounging areas, sensible mini fridge/galley layout, and cabin headroom near 6'6"—features that match how families and charter guests typically use the boat for island hopping and short overnight trips; one charter report said it “exceeded expectations in every way.”

From an ownership perspective, the triple outboard arrangement is uncomplicated provided owners maintain routine care: flush after exposure to

saltwater and adhere to manufacturer service intervals. Many owners fit options such as a SeaKeeper gyro, generator, and joystick/electronics packages; while these enhance capability, they also introduce additional service requirements and software maintenance. At about 35 feet with notable engine and gear weight, most owners rely on marina wet/dry storage or lifts, and hauling usually requires heavy lifting equipment.

Pros and Cons

- Confident, stable ride in chop from the deep V, 23° deadrise hull and “wave eating” character.
- Versatile crossover layout that supports family cruising, entertaining, and offshore fishing.
- True weekender comfort with a full cabin (~6'6" headroom), shaded helm, and practical galley/mini fridge.
- Triple outboard setup requires regular flushing and timely manufacturer specified services.
- Optional systems (SeaKeeper, generator, joystick/electronics) add maintenance tasks and ongoing costs.
- At about 35 feet with significant weight, most owners will depend on marina storage and heavy equipment for hauling.

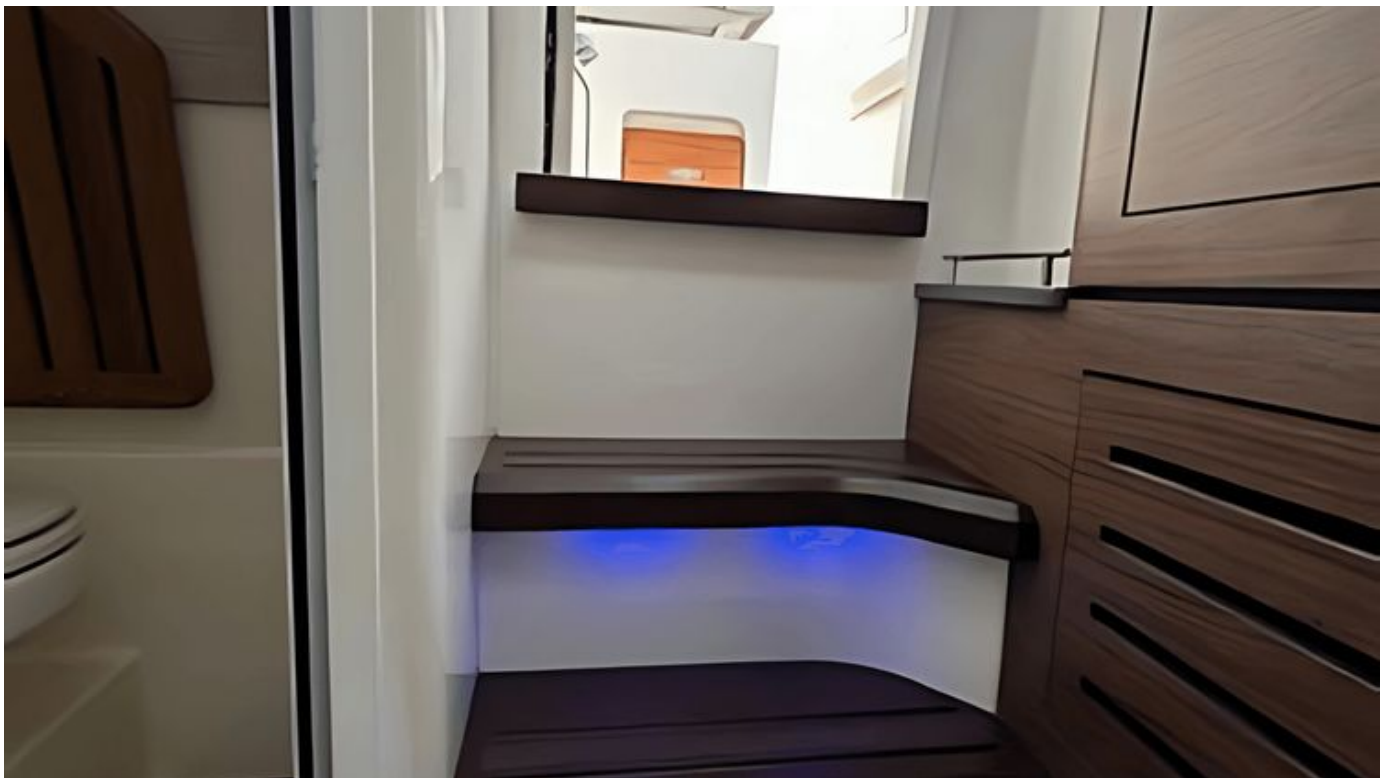

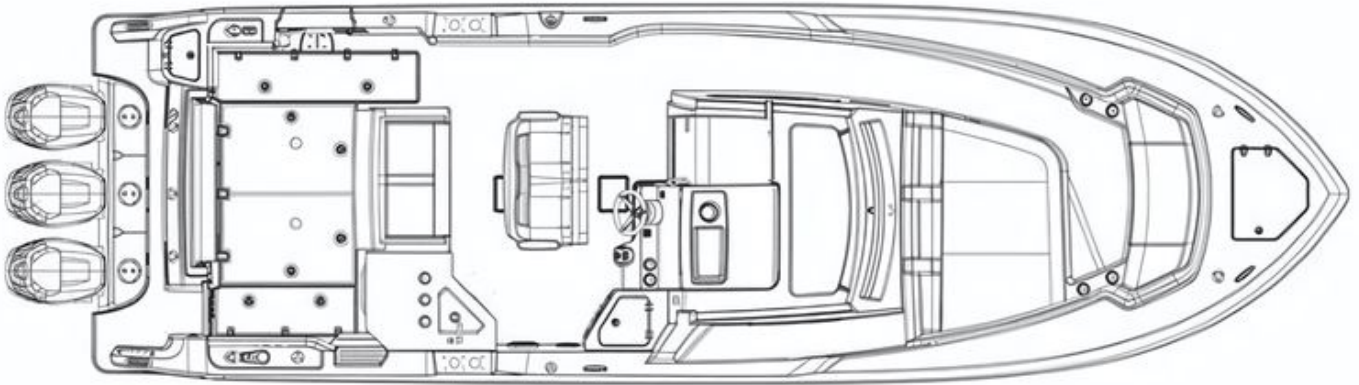
