Q1: What kind of boat is the 2486 OB? A1: It's a versatile deck boat within the broader motor yacht grouping, constructed on a **durable hull** in fiberglass construction.

Q2: What is the engine setup on this model? A2: The boat is specified with **1 Yamaha outboard** running on **Gas/Petrol**, offering straightforward operation and maintenance.

Q3: What are the key dimensions? A3: The **LOA** is 24 ft (7.32 m) and the **beam** is 8 ft (2.56 m), yielding a stable layout well suited to family day boating.

Q4: How much fuel does it carry? A4: The **fuel capacity** is 66 gallons, appropriate for typical **day cruising** and watersports use.

Owner Experience Review

In owner reports and listing notes, HURRICANE's 2486 OB frequently appears as a family-oriented day boat that excels at cruising, entertaining, and towing. Owners highlight the adaptable, open-plan seating that converts for socializing and sunbathing, along with generous under-seat and in-floor stowage that keeps the deck uncluttered. Many owners fit larger outboards in the 250–300 hp range for watersports; several report comfortable nearshore hops or runs of 2–4 miles offshore when conditions are calm, always noting the need to respect sea state and adjust speed accordingly.

On the water, professional testing and owner-measured figures describe the 2486 OB as both quick and agile. With a Yamaha F300, owners have recorded about 32.6 mph at 4000 rpm, 41.5 mph at 5000 rpm, and 49.4 mph at 5900 rpm, with typical cruising speeds in the 27–41 mph band depending on load and prop choice. Pilots report composed behavior in light chop and 1–3 ft swells, rapid planing, and predictable handling that gives less experienced boaters added confidence.

Comfort aboard centers on the smart convertible seating layout, including a flip-up aft backrest that forms a U-shaped lounge, while storage solutions earn

consistent praise. Several owners replace the factory audio and base electronics early in ownership, and some add a bow bimini for enhanced shade. Routine upkeep is generally straightforward—the materials resist staining and mildew and the outboard arrangement simplifies servicing—though community threads reference occasional slow fueling/venting quirks (with tank access reportedly under the rear convertible seat) and sporadic fit issues between certain aftermarket anchors and the anchor locker/hanger.

Pros and Cons

- Flexible, convertible seating with a flip-up aft section creates true social space for entertaining.
- Fast and nimble performance with solid planing and stable manners in light chop.
- Abundant storage, easy-clean materials, and outboard layout that simplifies service.
- Base audio and entry-level electronics feel underwhelming and are often upgraded.
- Some owners report slow fueling/venting quirks and accessing the tank under the rear seat.
- Anchor locker/hanger fit can be finicky with certain aftermarket anchors and may need adjustment.
