The 40 Catamaran from INVINCIBLE is a multi-role motor catamaran built on a rugged fiberglass hull platform. It is driven by four Mercury outboards, carries a single head, and offers a large fuel capacity for extended passages.

Opting for the 40 Catamaran is a sensible choice if you want a 40-foot motor yacht that benefits from a catamaran layout while relying on the redundancy and power of quad Mercury outboards. The 12-foot beam delivers generous deck real estate, and the fiberglass construction with fiberglass deck components emphasizes longevity and simplified upkeep. - Quad Mercury outboards: 4 engines, **Outboard** configuration, **Gas/Petrol** fuel.
- 40 ft (12.19 m) LOA and 12 ft (3.66 m) beam offering the scale and deck area expected in a catamaran format.
- Hull conforms to fiberglass and plastic construction standards; the deck is molded fiberglass for easier maintenance.
- Single head fitted for basic onboard sanitary needs.
- 640-gallon fuel capacity to permit longer passages between refueling stops.

Owner Experience Review

Owners favor the 40 Catamaran from INVINCIBLE for offshore sportfishing and fast single day runs; routes such as Key West to the Dry Tortugas are commonly cited examples. The platform is also routinely used for family cruises, diving trips, and watersports, and its configuration makes it popular with charter operators and guides due to a very large, flat aft deck and substantial fishbox volume. When equipped with larger tanks, owners report the boat can sustain high speeds while providing meaningful range for weekend passages.

On the water the model delivers brisk speeds, a composed ride, and vast usable deck area. The asymmetrical sponson design enables carving and cornering with a feel similar to a V hulled boat, which tends to inspire confidence at higher speeds. Independent trials with quad Mercury 350 Verados recorded a top speed near 71 mph and acceleration to 30 mph in roughly 8.7–10 seconds, while owners note that handling differs from that of monohulls—diligent trim control and attention to snap roll tendency are part of the learning curve.

Daily comfort revolves around broad, level working decks and large storage capacity, including oversized coffin boxes (for example, 960 quart units) and multiple fish boxes fore and aft. The helm area affords strong sightlines, adaptable seating, and a sturdy hardtop, although the console lacks a step down cabin, which limits interior headroom for those moving through the console space. Maintenance access is generally straightforward, but a quad outboard setup does increase routine service requirements and

associated costs; some owners report insurers requiring operator training specific to handling larger power cats.

No persistent, model specific failures have become widely reported, but owners recommend budgeting for significant annual maintenance expenditures. Several owners have opted for performance focused packages — quad 350 Verados, dual 400 gallon tanks (about 800 gallons total), and twin 24 inch multi function displays — underscoring the model's adaptability to high performance outfitting.

Pros and Cons

- Capable of high speed and a comfortable ride, with exceptionally large deck areas suitable for serious fishing and sizable day boat groups.
- Asymmetrical sponsons create a cornering characteristic that mimics V hull behavior, delivering predictable turns.
- Massive fish and gear storage combined with a helm that offers great visibility supports extended days on the water.
- The absence of a step down inside the console constrains interior headroom for occupants.
- Quad outboards result in increased routine maintenance and insurance costs compared with simpler propulsion arrangements.
- Handling differs from a monohull and requires careful trim management and experience to control snap roll.
