OVERVIEW

The 445 from ISLAND PACKET is a seaworthy sail yacht conceived for confident long-distance passages and comfortable liveaboard life. It sits within the ranks of purposeful cruising sailboats and is built on a time-tested fiberglass hull. Offered for sale through Andrey Shestakov and the team at Shestakov Yacht Sales.

Selecting a 445

Opting for the 445 is a sensible decision if you prioritize manageable handling in a 45 ft (13.94 m) platform, significant interior volume from a 14 ft (4.37 m) beam, and a cruising arrangement suited to both family life and extended passages. The layout supports up to 7 people with 2 heads, striking a balance between private cabins and communal spaces. Propulsion is kept straightforward with a single inboard Yanmar diesel, and generous tankage—260 gal of water and 160 gal of fuel—extends the range between reprovisioning stops. For buyers seeking a reliable cruising sailboat within the broader sail yacht market, the 445 presents a persuasive option.

Features of the Model

- **Structure:** a robust fiberglass hull coupled with a Fiberglass deck for cruising that demands minimal upkeep.
- **Propulsion:** single Yanmar inboard diesel for simplified ownership and routine servicing.
- **Capacities:** 260 gallons of freshwater and 160 gallons of diesel fuel to lengthen your time offshore.
- **Liveability:** up to 7 berths and 2 heads to accommodate family or crew with comfort.

- Dimensions: 45 ft LOA, 14 ft beam, and a 16.404 ft (5 m) draft that contributes to assured tracking and stability underway.

Q: What type of yacht is the 445? A: It is a sail yacht marketed as a dedicated cruising sailboat built on a sturdy fiberglass hull.

Q: How many people can the boat accommodate? A: The 445 offers **accommodations** for up to 7 and features **2 heads** for comfortable onboard living.

Q: What are the key dimensions? A: The 445 measures **LOA** 45 ft (13.94 m), with a **beam** of 14 ft (4.37 m) and a **draft** of 16.404 ft (5 m).

Q: What engine powers the yacht? A: Propulsion comes from a single **Yanmar Inboard Diesel** engine, chosen for dependable performance and easy maintenance.

Owner Experience Review

Owners who have selected the ISLAND PACKET 445 most often cite its suitability for bluewater sailing and long-term cruising. Launched in 2004, the design is a heavy-displacement, full-foil/long-keel type that feels well-anchored in 20–25 knots and maintains sail through a chop; multiple owners emphasize how steady and comfortable the interior remains on passages—one owner remarked, “we have sailed 6000 miles ... never seen a boat more stable or comfortable down below during a passage.”

Aboard, the center-cockpit arrangement, spacious saloon, and walk-around aft island berth with an en-suite head create a genuinely liveable layout. The generous tankage and storage—typically listed near 260 US gal of water and 160 US gal of fuel—support extended provisioning, which is why couples often choose the 445 for full-time liveaboard life and long-range cruising; the twin island berths and two heads are also well-suited to family voyaging or occasional owner/guest charter operations.

There are performance and upkeep considerations to bear in mind. Several owners report the boat is sluggish in light wind conditions, and a critical owner described the aft cabin as impractical at sea while noting a tacking angle approaching 110°. For maintenance, owners recommend close inspection and potential upgrading of chainplates on older examples, appreciating the walk-around engine access beneath the cockpit, and budgeting for the more intrusive and sometimes higher-cost work that can accompany encapsulated tanks and a heavier, more robust construction compared to lighter cruisers.

Pros and Cons

- Bluewater heritage with a planted, comfortable offshore motion, even in 20–25 knots.
- Substantial tankage (around 260 gal water and 160 gal fuel) and plentiful storage favor liveaboard lifestyles and long-distance cruising.
- Center-cockpit arrangement with a walk-around aft island berth and two heads offers notable privacy and everyday convenience.
- Less lively in light-air conditions when compared to lighter-displacement cruisers.
- One critical owner described the aft cabin as unusable at sea and cited an upwind tacking angle near 110°.
- Maintenance can be more expensive and invasive because of encapsulated systems; chainplates and rig attachment points merit careful attention.
