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OVERVIEW

The Lagoon 55 from LAGOON CATAMARANS represents a modern sailing platform on a stable multihull underbody, constructed with a fiberglass and plastic hull. Offered by Andrey Shestakov and Shestakov Yacht Sales, it combines abundant living volume with reliable systems ideal for long-range cruising or upscale charter operations.

Selecting a Lagoon 55

Opting for the Lagoon 55 places emphasis on generous interior and deck space, inherent stability, and straightforward systems. Measuring 60 ft (18.38 m) overall with a 29 ft (9 m) beam, the design creates wide social areas and storage while maintaining systems that are manageable for owners or small crews.

Owner Experience Review

Owners and charterers often describe the Lagoon 55 from LAGOON CATAMARANS as well suited to family bluewater passages, professional charter service, and lively weekend escapes. The generously appointed flybridge—complete with helm seating, a sink, and refrigeration—and the broad aft cockpit facilitate effortless alfresco living for larger groups, while the luminous saloon and adaptable layouts (4–6 cabins with the option of galley-up or galley-down) work equally well for private ownership or charter operations. One charter guest captured the mood succinctly: “We loved every moment! The kids had so much fun, the food was absolutely delicious.”

Underway feedback and sea trials point to a comfortable and steady motion. A typical power trial recorded about 9 knots at roughly 2,000 rpm, and community reports note “they comfortably reached at 8–10 knots and beat at 6 or more,” though some owners observed that “the steering seemed a bit sluggish both motoring and under sail.” For most cruising scenarios the priority is predictable behavior and a gentle ride rather than ultra-responsive helm feedback.

Expectations for ownership lean toward dealing with large-boat systems. Many owners employ a captain and mate to manage routine upkeep and operations, particularly when the yacht is fitted with options like the hydraulic tender/swim platform (often rated around 750 kg), which enhances functionality but increases complexity and expense. Engines are frequently Nanni diesels in practice (upgraded 115 hp noted), so scheduled engine and saildrive servicing is standard, and initial commissioning tweaks are common as a new boat settles in.

Pros and Cons

- Expansive flybridge and aft cockpit enable genuine outdoor living for large groups.
- Flexible interiors with 4–6 cabins and galley-up or galley-down suit private use or charter.
- Comfortable, stable ride with real-world reports of ~9 knots under power and 8–10 knots reaching.
- Steering feel can be a bit sluggish both under sail and when motoring.
- Size and systems drive higher ongoing service needs, with many owners opting for professional crew.
- Hydraulic tender/swim platform adds capability but also complexity and cost.

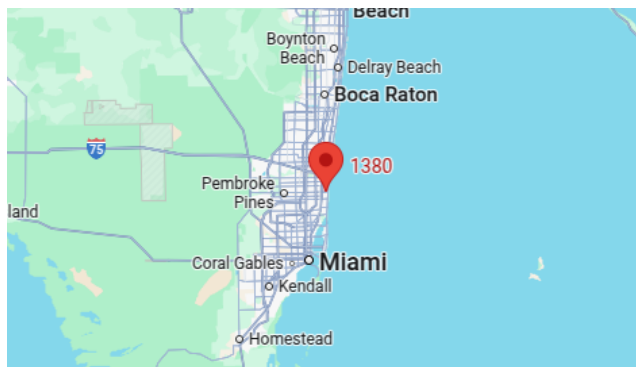
