## OVERVIEW

---

The 39 from Leopard Catamarans is a sailing catamaran that pairs twin Yanmar engines with Sail Drive transmissions with an expansive 19 ft (6.04 m) beam and comfortable accommodation for four guests across two heads. The yacht is offered by Andrey Shestakov of Shestakov Yacht Sales.

## Selecting a 39

---

Opt for the 39 if you need a compact 37 ft (11.43 m) LOA platform that still delivers a broad 19 ft (6.04 m) beam, dual Yanmar Sail Drive diesels, and the proven durability of a composite deck over a fiberglass/plastic hull. As a sail yacht catamaran, it offers easy-to-manage sailing characteristics while maximizing liveboard and cruising space for a party of four.

## Questions and Answers

---

Q: What is the type of the 39? A: It's a sail yacht catamaran built by Leopard Catamarans. Key details include the **type** (sail) and **builder** .

Q: What are the key dimensions? A: The **LOA** is 37 ft (11.43 m), **Beam** is 19 ft (6.04 m), and **Draft** is 12.85 ft (3.9166 m).

Q: What powers the yacht? A: Twin **engines** from **Yanmar** with **Sail Drive** transmissions running on **Diesel** .

Q: How many people can it accommodate and what are the tank capacities? A:

It **sleeps** 4 with 2 **heads** ; **water** capacity is 206.05 gal and **fuel** capacity is 92.46 gal.

Q: What materials are used in construction? A: The hull is fiberglass/plastic, and the **deck** is Composite, providing a robust platform for this catamaran.

## Owner Experience Review

---

Owners commonly choose the 39 for coastal cruising with couples or small families, liveaboard comfort in the favored owner's 3 cabin layout, and relaxed weekend island hopping in regions like the Bahamas, the Keys, and the Mediterranean. Charter fleets have also used 4 cabin arrangements through Moorings and Sunsail, and professional delivery captains report intermittent ocean crossings, indicating that while the yacht is primarily used for coastal work, longer passages are feasible with careful preparation.

Under sail, owners describe a lively yet predictable feel, with handling that rewards attentive helmsmanship; the raised, sheltered helm places control lines within easy reach so most sail changes and maneuvers can be executed from the helm seat. One owner noted, "She sails beautifully... quickly reaching 6/7 knots with only 10 to 12 knots of wind," and typical cruising speeds are often in the high 6 to mid 8 knot range in 10-15 knots of breeze, with faster surges when conditions improve. The bridgedeck height and hull form help temper slamming, contributing to a motion that owners find confidence inspiring rather than skittish.

Living aboard the 39 reflects Leopard Catamarans' emphasis on owner comfort: a prominent owner's cabin with a walk in shower and plentiful stowage that many describe as feeling like a "second home." The main deck galley layout, effective fridge/freezer configuration, and overall ergonomics simplify provisioning for extended trips. Social circulation aboard is well thought out; the cockpit hardtop and elevated helm position keep the skipper

part of the guest area, reinforcing another owner's comment that the boat is "easy to steer... most maneuvers done from the captain seat."

From a maintenance standpoint, recurring survey feedback highlights the need for attention to deck fittings and any balsa cored areas, where degraded sealant can allow water ingress. Saildrive corrosion and wear are frequent concerns on older saltwater boats; while Yanmar diesel engines are widely respected for reliability, owners occasionally report raw water exhaust/elbow leaks along with the standard diesel and electrical wear items. Engine access located in the aft hulls is commonly praised, but prospective buyers of older or ex charter boats should plan on routine replacements or servicing of saildrives, standing and running rigging, and electrical components.

## Pros and Cons

---

- Raised, protected helm with lines led aft supports easy single handed and keeps the skipper connected to the cockpit social area.
- Lively, predictable sailing with high 6 to mid 8 knot cruising in 10–15 kt and moderated slamming for a confident ride.
- Owner friendly layout with a true owner's suite, walk in shower, ample storage, and a practical main deck galley for provisioning.
- Inspect for potential water intrusion around deck fittings and in cored areas on aging boats.
- Saildrive corrosion/wear in saltwater is common; verify condition and service records.
- Ex charter or older boats often need budget for rigging, electrical, and saildrive refresh despite good engine access.

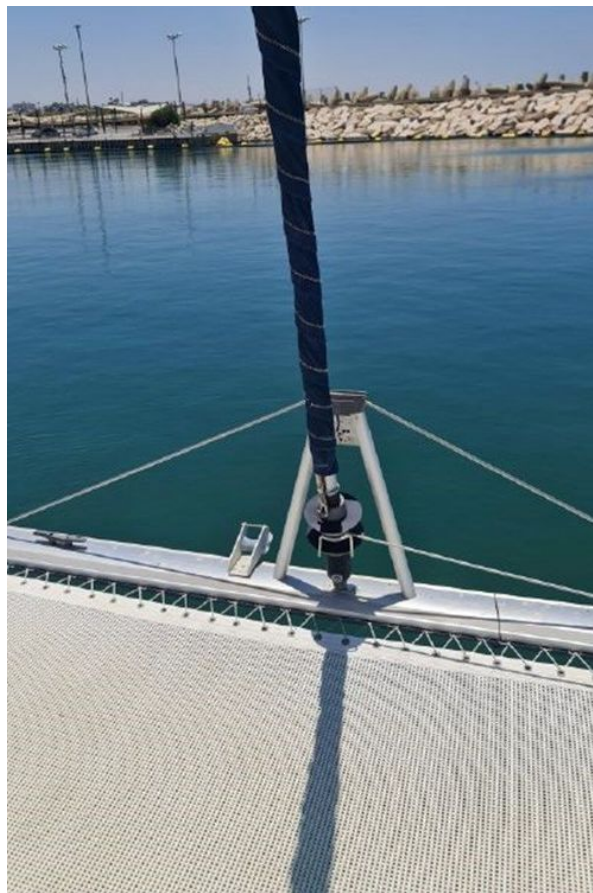
