Owner Experience Review

Owners boarding the 155 by Majesty Yachts commonly report a composed and comfortable ride. Professional assessments describe the yacht as straightforward to handle, very stable, and comparatively quiet, producing a minimal wake. The round-bilge displacement hull form and twin commercial-grade MTUs (often detuned to extend service life) emphasize economy and range over outright speed; owners can expect an efficient long-range cruise in the 10–14 knot band, a manufacturer-quoted range in excess of 4,200 nm, and a reported top speed around 16–17.5 knots.

Onboard life is shaped by the three-deck layout: multiple saloons, a flybridge spa/Jacuzzi, and a beach club provide dispersed spaces for family and guests. Delivered examples have demonstrated upscale fit-outs — including marble and onyx details, premium appliances, and advanced AV systems — and some configurations place the owner's suite on the main or upper deck with features

such as a fold-down balcony or private terrace. Charter-focused builds have been reported with as many as roughly eight staterooms, while crew accommodations are typically dimensioned for 5–10+ personnel, making the platform well suited to extended family cruising, large-group entertaining, and commercial charter operations.

Serviceability rates highly: the yacht offers a spacious, air-conditioned engine room and generous access throughout machinery spaces. The builder fabricates many systems in-house and supports owners through a Superyacht Service Centre, yet prospective buyers should budget for standard superyacht maintenance and operating costs, commonly estimated at around 10% of vessel value per year. While an owner of a delivered hull has publicly praised the build quality, anecdotal long-term forum discussions around earlier, smaller Majesty models have mentioned workmanship and mechanical concerns; therefore a comprehensive survey and sea trial are strongly recommended.

- Long-range displacement design with a stated range beyond 4,200 nm at efficient cruising speeds.
- Reported easy handling, stability, and quiet operation with minimal wake.
- Expansive three-deck volume featuring multiple saloons, a flybridge spa/Jacuzzi, a beach club, and high-end finishes on delivered hulls.
- Design focus on efficiency and endurance rather than sprint performance; reported top speeds generally fall in the 16–17.5 knot range.
- Historical owner feedback on earlier, smaller Majesty yachts has included notes on quality control and mechanical issues, underscoring the importance of thorough surveys.
- Operates as a superyacht-class asset with crewed operation and maintenance expectations; typical running costs are approximately 10% of

value annually.

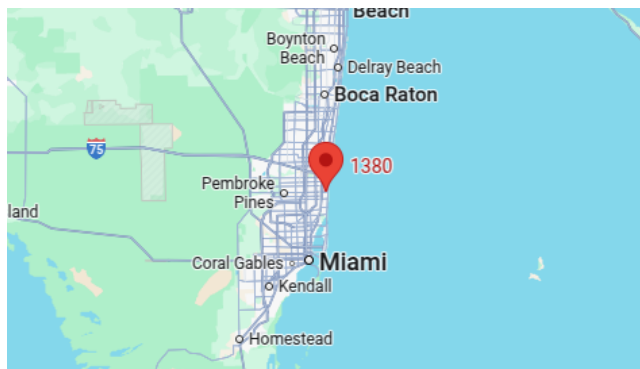
