OVERVIEW

The 39 Cuddy from Midnight Express Powerboats combines the punch of quad outboard propulsion with a functional cuddy layout aimed at anglers and daytime cruisers. Marketed as a motor yacht and outfitted for sport fisherman duties, it sits on a sturdy fiberglass hull. Shestakov Yacht Sales lists this design with broker Andrey Shestakov available to advise buyers.

Selecting a 39 Cuddy

Opt for the 39 Cuddy when you need a versatile craft that marries speed and practicality. With an overall length of 39 ft (11.89 m) and a beam of 9 ft (2.9 m), it strikes a compromise between cockpit room and nimble handling. The model is typically equipped with quad Mercury outboards as specified by Midnight Express Powerboats, providing reliable operation on **Gas/Petrol**. Tankage of 325 gallons for fuel and 45 gallons for fresh water supports extended day trips, while a single head provides onboard convenience. As a motor yacht purpose-built for sport fisherman activities, it's valued for its straightforward, multi-role capability.

- What type of yacht is the 39 Cuddy? A: It is a motor yacht set up for sport fisherman use, manufactured by Midnight Express Powerboats.
- What are the dimensions of the model? A: The **LOA** measures 39 ft (11.89 m) and the **Beam** measures 9 ft (2.9 m).
- What is the engine setup? A: It is fitted with **4 Mercury Outboard** engines that run on **Gas/Petrol** .
- What are the fuel and water capacities? A: **Fuel capacity** is 325 gallons and **Water capacity** is 45 gallons.
- What materials are used for the structure? A: The **Hull material** is fiberglass

Owner Experience Review

Owners of the 39 Cuddy by Midnight Express Powerboats commonly employ the boat for fast day runs and short coastal hops—regular trips to places like Catalina, Newport and Long Beach are frequently mentioned in owner discussions. The roomy cockpit and fish-focused layout, featuring bait tanks, fish boxes, and an operational deck, secure its reputation as a legitimate sportfishing platform, while many owners also enjoy it as a high-speed dayboat. Its civilian styling is rooted in designs developed for government and law-enforcement interceptor programs, which influences expectations for speed and seakeeping.

On the water, owners report a planing hull that feels firm and responsive, with nimble handling at pace. Typical cruising speeds reported are in the 40–50 mph range, while top speeds on heavily powered setups can run from the mid 50s up toward about 70 mph, depending on conditions and propeller choices. Performance and fuel consumption differ by propulsion: aside from quad outboard builds there are older cuddy variants with enclosed twin diesels; one diesel example noted roughly 16 gph at 3000 rpm—highlighting the range of operating profiles possible.

Comfort levels for a boat of this class are notable: the cuddy provides a V berth and an in console head/shower, and some listings include air conditioning and a generator. With a beam approaching 10 feet the cockpit is generous and the interior volume exceeds many comparable sportboats, delivering a practical galley/head layout; the deck plan favors anglers but also accommodates entertaining and fast coastal runs. Owners warn that quad outboard installations increase maintenance demands—particularly for vessels

kept in the water in marine environments—and older boats often require significant refit or repower work (engines, steering, electronics, soft goods), which can add materially to overall ownership costs.

Pros and Cons

- Solid, agile high speed handling with composure in rougher water.
- Large, fishing friendly cockpit also suits entertaining and fast day running.
- Usable cuddy with V berth and in console head/shower; some boats have A/C and a generator.
- Quad outboards drive higher maintenance, especially for boats kept in the water in ocean environments.
- Performance, fuel burn, and upkeep vary widely by propulsion and prop setup.
- Older boats may need substantial refit or repower work, adding cost.

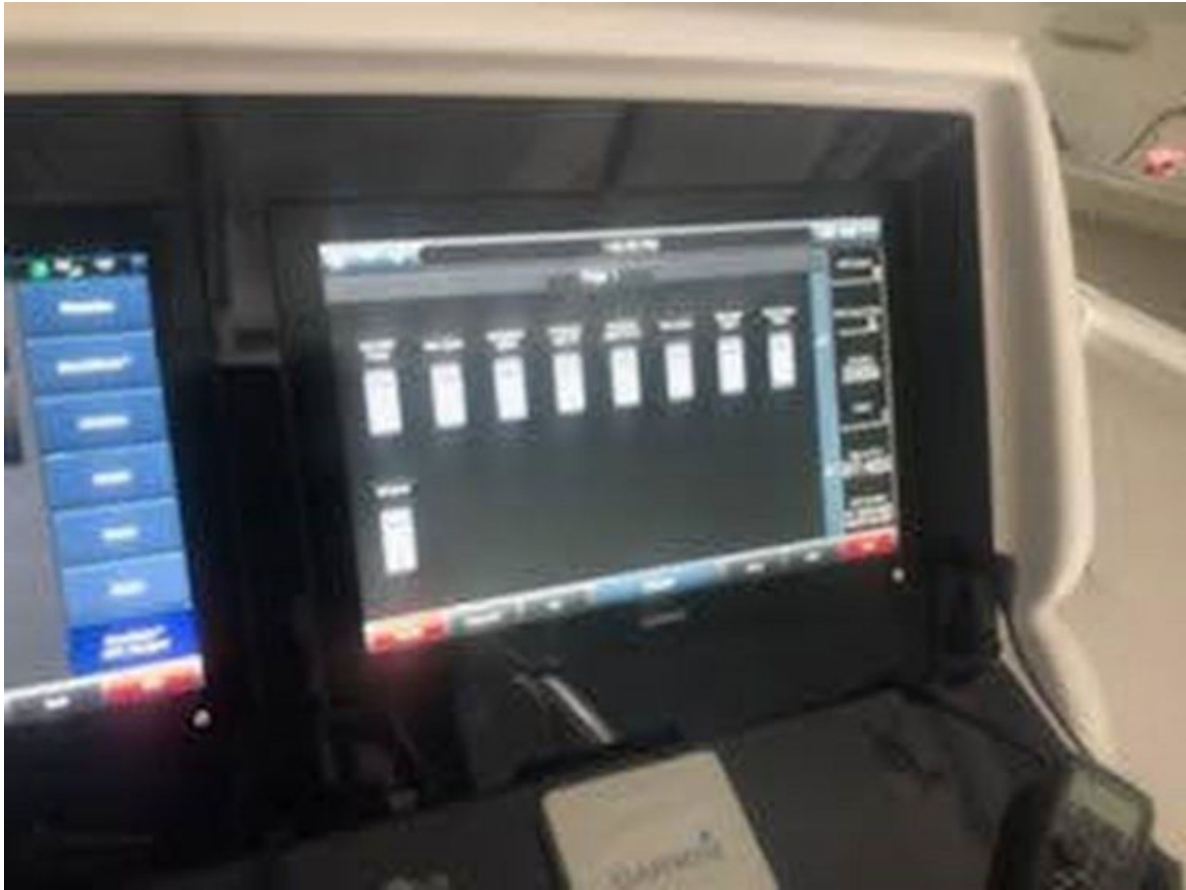
