OVERVIEW

The 375 GTO delivers an exhilarating blend of performance and usable comfort for fast coastal cruising. Positioned as a motor yacht in the cruiser segment and built on a fiberglass hull, it combines speed, cruising range, and overnight capability for two. Offered through Andrey Shestakov and Shestakov Yacht Sales.

Selecting a 375 GTO

Opt for the 375 GTO when you want a 37 foot platform with a generous 12 ft (3.66 m) beam, assured high speed handling, and the flexibility to stay aboard. Capable of a 40 kn cruise (46.03 mph) and a 50 kn top end (57.54 mph), powered by twin Mercury outboards and carrying 396 gallons of fuel, it's engineered for rapid passages and extended day runs. The interior supports overnighting for 2 with 1 head and 53 gallons of fresh water.

Q: What type of yacht is the 375 GTO? A: It's a motor yacht in the cruiser category built on a fiberglass hull, designed to pair lively performance with everyday comfort.

Q: How fast can the 375 GTO cruise and what is the top speed? A: Plan on a **40 kn** cruise speed (46.03 mph) and a **50 kn** maximum (57.54 mph), suited for quick hops and spirited coastal runs.

Q: What powers the 375 GTO? A: Twin **Mercury outboard** engines running on **Gas/Petrol** provide brisk acceleration and high-speed capability.

Q: How many people can stay aboard the 375 GTO overnight? A: The boat offers **accommodations for 2 and 1 head**, supported by **53 gal** of fresh water for short overnight trips.

Owner Experience Review

Owners are drawn to the 375 GTO for its fast, sociable approach to dayboating with the option to extend into a weekend cruise. Introduced as part of a GTO series in 2022, owners report top speeds in the 48–52 knot range when equipped with high power outboards and even triple engine configurations; the deep V planing hull contributes to a confident, sporty feel and a firm ride at speed. The helm layout receives consistent commendation—adjustable sport seats, multi screen electronics and broad sightlines—leading one reviewer to describe stepping into the helm “like stepping into a rocket ship.” On deck, reversible backrests, an extendable table, a broad sunpad and drop down balconies expand the social area for entertaining and raft ups.

Belowdecks, the arrangement can be configured for two cabins using a convertible bow dinette and a midship twin/guest cabin, plus a dedicated head with a standing shower; while compact, the interior is finished to a yacht standard. A forum contributor summarized the attraction: “The 375 GTO is a

beautiful boat, probably the one that comes closest to my idea.” Anglers note that a Fishing Edition introduces livewells, rod holders and a transom layout tailored for fishing. Regarding maintenance, outboards ease access to some systems but introduce regular service items (impellers, lower unit maintenance, control cables). The beach mode drop down balconies and hydraulic systems add mechanical and electrical complexity compared with a simple dayboat, so dealer and service support for these high tech systems is important; although the engines are externally mounted, primary service areas such as electrics, hydraulics and trim components are located beneath the cockpit and inside the console.

Pros and Cons

- Reported 48–52 knot top end with high power outboards and a deep V hull that inspires confidence at speed.
- Drop down balconies and a wide cockpit create an expansive, social deck ideal for entertaining and raft ups.
- Two cabin capability allows sleeping arrangements for up to four with a separate head and standing shower.
- Outboards introduce additional routine service points (impellers, lower units, controls).
- Beach mode/drop down balcony and hydraulic systems add mechanical and electrical complexity compared with simpler dayboats.
- Interior space is compact for longer cruises, despite a finish that meets yacht standards.
