The 2110 Sport from NAUTIC STAR is a compact, no-nonsense motor yacht built around a practical center console layout and a robust fiberglass and plastic hull. Measuring 21 ft (6.4 m) overall and typically powered by a single Yamaha gas outboard, it pairs straightforward performance with uncomplicated ownership. Questions and Answers

Q: What type of yacht is the 2110 Sport? A: It is a **motor yacht** built with a **center console layout** and a **fiberglass and plastic** hull.

Q: Who builds the 2110 Sport? A: The **builder** is NAUTIC STAR, a company recognized for practical center-console boats.

Q: What are the key dimensions? A: **LOA** is 21 ft (6.4 m), **beam** measures 7 ft

(2.34 m), and **minimum draft** is 3.007 ft (0.9166 m).

Q: What powers the boat and what fuel does it use? A: The boat is powered by **1 Yamaha outboard** (**engine type** : Outboard) running on **gas** .

Owner Experience Review

Owners who pilot the 2110 Sport from NAUTIC STAR most often use it for inshore bay and jetty angling—Galveston Bay is frequently mentioned—and as a flexible 21' day boat for family outings and fishing. It also gets occasional light tow duty; several owners report it "pulls skier pretty good" when used for casual watersports like wakeboarding or tubing.

On the water, owners commonly quote cruise/top speeds "about 40 to 45ish" in smoother conditions and describe the ride as composed—"pretty dry" for a boat of this size—while warning it will become wetter and less comfortable in sloppy, choppy seas. Some owners say the boat can feel "tight" in turns unless the outboard is trimmed properly; many recommend adding trim tabs and/or a jack plate to improve planing angle and shallow-water running. The subject of propulsion comes up repeatedly: while the hull is rated to 200 hp, owners note 150 hp can feel underpowered once you add a T-top and extra gear, and many prefer 175–200 hp for optimal performance.

The deck plan draws praise for its functionality, with owners citing a "nice layout and plenty of storage," and the seating/console arrangement comfortably accommodates roughly 4–6 people on day trips. Typical owner upgrades include installing a T-top and a leaning post for shade and utility. On the maintenance side, there are occasional reports—one owner noted a

fuel-tank leak on a new 2014 model—and forum discussions reference water in fuel and intermittent dealer/warranty disagreements; many owners also refine performance through prop changes and engine tuning.

Pros and Cons

- A fisherman-friendly layout with ample storage makes it well suited for versatile day-boat use.
- Respectable performance in calm conditions, with owners noting roughly 40–45ish mph.
- Generally composed handling and a "pretty dry" ride in moderate bay conditions.
- Can become wet and uncomfortable in sloppy, choppy seas.
- A 150 hp package can feel marginal when fitted with a T-top or heavy load; many owners prefer 175–200 hp.
- Some reports of water in fuel and an isolated fuel-tank leak, along with mixed experiences with dealer support.
