OVERVIEW

The 26 OBX from Regal is a nimble motor yacht constructed on a fiberglass and plastic hull, blending sporty on-water performance with the simplicity expected of a day boat. Propulsion is provided by a single Yamaha outboard running on gas/petrol, giving the model a top capability of about 50 knots (57.54 mph). Selecting a 26 OBX

Select the 26 OBX if you prioritize lively performance, compact handling, and the simplicity of a single-engine layout. Measuring 26 ft LOA with an 8 ft beam, it remains easy to maneuver while providing practical capacities for day excursions — 103 gallons of fuel and 12 gallons of fresh water. Its draft range (from 5.195 ft to 9.843 ft) combined with a solid fiberglass and plastic build make it a confident choice in the motor yacht segment. Q: What type of yacht is the 26 OBX? A: It is a motor yacht constructed on a fiberglass and plastic hull, well suited for **day boating** and **sporty cruising** .

Owner Experience Review

Owners commonly select the Regal 26 OBX as a family runabout for lakes, bays, and coastal day cruising; many examples are trailered or kept on lifts. With reported production spanning 2014–2025, the model has established itself as a reliable day trip platform that can handle occasional overnighting thanks to the enclosed console head. The 26 foot layout is frequently praised for feeling roomy relative to its size, with features like the reversible Social Seat, the multi position Ultra Lounge at the transom, and abundant storage receiving steady compliments.

On the water, the stepped FasTrac hull is credited for efficient performance and responsive handling; most owners pair the boat with a Yamaha F300 and report brisk acceleration, economical cruising in the midrange, and tested top speeds in the vicinity of 50 mph. Helm feedback, tracking, and confidence in light chop are commonly noted, and the outboard setup simplifies servicing compared with sterndrives. Routine maintenance centers on the outboard and electronics, and while owners do not report a specific recurring mechanical failure, some note upholstery and trim wear or peeling on bench seats over time; newer boats often benefit from extended factory warranty coverage from Yamaha.

Pros and Cons

- Efficient, responsive ride from the stepped FasTrac hull with reported top speeds around 50 mph on Yamaha F300 power.
- Versatile cockpit featuring the reversible Social Seat, multi position Ultra Lounge, and generous storage for family use.
- An enclosed, plumbed head adds comfort and allows occasional overnights on what is primarily a day boat platform.
- Some owners report upholstery and trim wear or peeling on bench seats over time.
- Best suited to day boating; onboard accommodations are limited for extended cruising.
- Requires routine servicing of the outboard and onboard electronics despite generally reliable ownership experiences.
