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OVERVIEW

Represented by Andrey Shestakov and the team at Shestakov Yacht Sales, the 260BX from Regal is a flexible and capable motor yacht constructed on a trusted fiberglass and plastic foundation. Measuring 26 ft (7.92 m) LOA and powered by a single Yamaha Outboard, it delivers an efficient cruise of 30 kn (34.52 mph) with a reported top end near 45 kn (51.78 mph), striking a balance between economy and performance.

Selecting a 260BX

The 260BX pairs a single Yamaha Outboard with brisk cruise and top-end speeds while its fiberglass and plastic hull and Fiberglass deck keep upkeep manageable. Owner Experience Review

Owners most often deploy the 260BX for family day trips and social cruising, valuing the expansive bow and a convertible Ultralounge that comfortably accommodates groups. The passenger console houses an enclosed head that supports short overnight stays, complemented by a freshwater sink and plentiful cockpit storage. Many examples come outfitted with upscale trim and a Fusion stereo, and the overall fit-and-finish from Regal is regularly commended; however, some owners have reported durability concerns with certain trim pieces—one owner observed, "the leather ish cloth on the one bench seat in the cabin is peeling away. It's a known issue."

On the water, the stepped hull with approximately 21° of transom deadrise gets the boat up on plane promptly and lowers resistance for economical cruising. With a single 300 hp outboard (often a Yamaha F300), owners describe a lively, responsive ride—typically around 30 knots at cruise and roughly 45 knots at top end on F300-equipped boats. The boat handles confidently in calm to moderate chop but isn't designed as a heavy offshore blue-water vessel—owners commonly describe it as "meant to hang around local bays," though some have completed hundred-mile runs when conditions permit. Servicing is straightforward for an outboard arrangement: routine maintenance and regular lower-unit inspections are advised, lift or rack storage helps curb corrosion, and several owners mention a rise in warranty claims in recent years, making reliable dealer support important.

Pros and Cons

- Roomy bow area and convertible Ultralounge make it well suited to family day-cruising and entertaining.
- Stepped hull and ~21° deadrise at the transom allow quick planing, efficient underway performance, and a sporty feel in calm-to-moderate sea states.
- Single Yamaha F300 outboard delivers lively acceleration, with reported cruise speeds near 30 knots and top speeds around 45 knots on examples equipped with that engine.
- Not intended as a heavy-offshore, blue-water hull; best deployed in bays and for fair-weather passages.
- Some owners have noted durability issues with trim and upholstery, including peeling on a cabin bench seat.
- Discussions among owners indicate an uptick in warranty claims in recent years, so attentive dealer and after-sale support is valuable.
