The 195 Sportfish from SCOUT combines Yamaha outboard propulsion with a compact 19-foot hull. Classified as a motor yacht in the sport fisherman category, it's built for anglers and efficient day excursions. Selecting a 195 Sportfish

With a 19 ft LOA (5.79 m) and an 8 ft beam (2.56 m), powered by a single Yamaha outboard running on Gas, this model offers a compact but capable package. Its 43 gal fuel tank is sized for typical day-use cruising and fishing. If you want a motor yacht that fits the sport fisherman brief for targeted angling, this boat is a strong candidate. Owner Experience Review

Owners most commonly employ SCOUT's 195 Sportfish as an inshore or nearshore sportfisher, making use of the tournament-style leaning post and built-in livewell. The open deck and reversible cushions also convert the boat into a comfortable platform for family outings and evening cruises; many examples are trailered or stored on lifts for mixed coastal and lake operation. Market activity and listings indicate the model has been traded and reviewed regularly from about 2014 through 2024.

On the water, testers praise the pronounced bow flare and Scout's NuV3 variable-deadrise hull for softening chop, and published performance figures show typical cruise speeds in the mid-20s to high-30s mph with top-end runs around 41–45 mph depending on F115 vs F150 power and load conditions. One owner summed up the ride: "It's rock solid; better ride than quite a few 22-23ft center consoles I've been on." Several owners note that the 115 hp installation can feel underpowered for some expectations, while the boat is rated to 150 hp and benefits noticeably from the higher-rated engine for livelier performance.

In everyday use the layout often feels roomier than the dimensions suggest, thanks to high gunwales and plentiful storage beneath the console and the forward casting platform; the compromise is the absence of an under-console head/porta-potty and limited cockpit fish-locker volume, which may limit comfort on extended outings. Yamaha F115/F150 pairings are common, and owners report routine annual or 100-hour maintenance — oil changes, gear lube, filters, and water-separator servicing — with easy access provided by the outboard arrangement and broad Yamaha dealer support. A minority of

owner/forum posts cite cosmetic or finish imperfections and occasional electrical quirks, and there are isolated reports of structural delamination on older Scout hulls; conversely, pride of ownership is frequently expressed — one seller noted the boat "has been extremely well-taken care of and treated like a member of our family."

Pros and Cons

- Handles chop confidently thanks to pronounced bow flare and SCOUT's NuV3 hull.
- Open, roomy deck with high gunwales and ample stowage suits fishing and family day boating.
- Outboard setup with common Yamaha F115/F150 power makes routine service straightforward.
- 115 hp can feel marginal, and many owners prefer the available 150 hp for brisk performance.
- No under-console head and limited cockpit fish-box capacity reduce comfort on longer days.
- Isolated owner reports cite cosmetic/finish issues and occasional electrical gremlins.

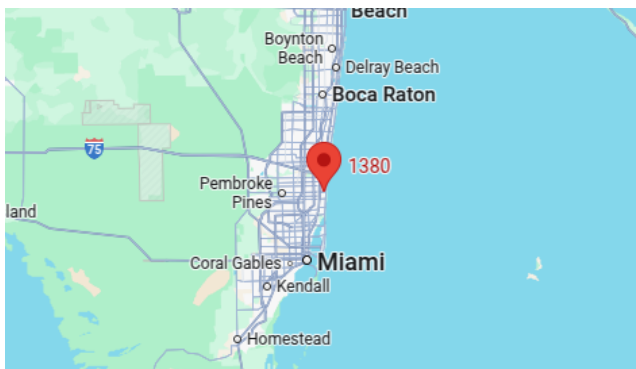
