Crafted by SEA RAY, the 370 VENTURE represents a flexible cruiser in the broader motor yacht category, built on a fiberglass and plastic hull with a molded fiberglass deck. This listing is offered through Shestakov Yacht Sales, with brokerage handled by Andrey Shestakov.

Selecting a 370 VENTURE

Opt for the 370 VENTURE when twin Mercury outboards, uncomplicated two person overnight accommodations, and the maneuverability and footprint of a cruiser sized motor yacht are priorities. Questions and Answers

Q: What are the dimensions of the 370 VENTURE? A: The yacht's **LOA** is 37 ft (11.33 m), **Beam** is 11 ft (3.43 m), and maximum **Draft** is 7.928 ft (2.4166 m).

Q: What powers this model? A: It's equipped with **2 Mercury Outboard** engines using **Gas** fuel for reliable propulsion.

Q: What type of yacht is it? A: It's a cruiser positioned within the wider family of motor yachts.

Q: What are the hull and deck materials? A: **Hull** is fiberglass and plastic and **Deck** is Fiberglass.

Q: What are the onboard capacities and accommodations? A: **Fuel capacity** is 222 gal, **Water capacity** is 31 gal, with **Sleeps 2** and **1 head** to support simple cruising plans.

Owner Experience Review

Owners commonly deploy the 370 VENTURE from SEA RAY for family coastal runs, day time social outings, and extended weekend trips. The express cruiser arrangement, complete with a full width swim platform and a roomy, sociable cockpit, lends itself to hosting and easy water access. Reviews and sales listings frequently highlight the aft lounge and sunpad configuration that conceals the outboards, while noting the cabin's relative spaciousness for a 37 foot express, including a full galley and comfortable sleeping arrangements for short stays.

On the water, operators report a notably quiet, low vibration experience attributed to the hidden outboard installation, along with shoal draft capability and diminished corrosion exposure in coastal environments. Owners also note sensitivity to load and propeller choice: some boats require 20–30 seconds to get on plane with tanks around three quarters full and several adults aboard, prompting many to experiment with prop pitch, cupping, and different models to sharpen hole shot and cruising rpm. Reported figures include roughly 5,200–5,300 rpm to sustain plane at about 25 mph, and wide open throttle around 6,300–6,400 rpm yielding speeds in the low 40s, depending on configuration.

Maintenance feedback is mixed. Several owners have observed spider style cracking in laminated glass panels exposed to strong sunlight, and one seller reported water intrusion that damaged overhead panels and aft carpeting, resulting in mildew. A dealer described some of the cracking as a manufacturing issue tied to prolonged sun exposure. In routine ownership,

operators also reference periodic ignition coil replacements on the outboards. While the concealed outboard concept delivers quieter operation and extra usable space, it can complicate service access and make ongoing prop tuning a regular part of ownership.

Pros and Cons

- Quiet, low vibration ride from the concealed outboard installation.
- Shoal water ability and reduced corrosion concerns for coastal cruising.
- Spacious cockpit and aft lounge with sunpads; cabin is roomy for weekend stays with a full galley.
- Planing and hole shot can be sluggish when loaded; prop selection and tuning are critical.
- Sun exposed laminated glass prone to spider cracking per owner reports and dealer feedback.
- Some owners report repeated ignition coil replacements on the outboards.
