Questions and Answers

Q: What type of yacht is the Mathis Trumpy Fantail? A: It is a classic motor yacht built on a wooden hull by TRUMPY, conceived by designer John Trumpy.

Q: What are the key dimensions? A: The **LOA** measures 91 ft (27.74 m), the **Beam** is 18 ft (5.49 m), and the **Draft** is 16.404 ft (5 m) for both minimum and maximum.

Q: How fast does it cruise and what is the top speed? A: The vessel's **Cruising speed** is 8 kn (9.21 mph) and the **Maximum speed** reaches 11.5 kn (13.23 mph).

Q: What engines power this yacht? A: It is driven by **2 Detroit Diesel** engines configured as **Inboard** units running on **Diesel** fuel.

Q: How is the yacht arranged for guests and crew? A: The boat has an **Accommodation count** of 6, **Sleeps** 5 guests, and includes **3 Heads** ; crew quarters comprise **3 crew cabins** with **5 crew beds** . Owner Experience Review

Owners typically acquire the Mathis Trumpy Fantail from TRUMPY for private, family-centered cruising and elegant classic-boat weekends rather than for commercial charter operations. Common itineraries include seasonal cruises in regions such as the Great Lakes, the Chesapeake Bay, and South Florida, along with appearances at classic-yacht events. On the water, proprietors report a semi-displacement motion characterized by a deliberate, graceful pace—favoring smooth, steady handling over high-speed performance—and a reputation for balanced seaworthiness and courteous manners.

Life aboard emphasizes spacious, traditional interiors: a generous salon and

dining suite, a capacious aft deck ideal for entertaining, and fine joinery in teak, mahogany, or comparable hardwoods. Original “houseboat”-style layouts often incorporate pantries or serving areas alongside comfortable guest cabins; many examples receive refits that add modern comforts like air conditioning, upgraded galleys, and current electronics. Vessels in the 50–80-foot bracket frequently show two staterooms plus crew accommodations, underscoring the model’s appeal for relaxed family cruising and understated hospitality.

Owning such a wooden yacht requires realistic expectations about upkeep. Extensive restorations spanning multiple years are commonplace, and annual shipyard periods are typically necessary; boats neglected for long intervals can suffer significant rot or marine-borer damage. Machinery spaces differ by craft—some retain original two-stroke diesels, while others have been subject to expensive repowers and systemic overhauls. For many owners, the satisfaction lies in conserving maritime history, accepting that stewardship—not top speed or charter revenue—defines the ownership experience.

Pros and Cons

- Graceful semi-displacement motion delivering comfortable, steady passages and straightforward handling.
- Generous classic interior and an ample aft-deck well suited to family cruising and entertaining.
- Attractive traditional joinery that presents strongly at preservation-focused gatherings.
- Modest cruising performance that values elegance and comfort over high speed.
- Wooden hull construction necessitates frequent yard maintenance and can demand major restoration efforts.
- Systems and propulsion often require modernization or costly repowering,

and long-term neglect risks rot or worm infestation.
