OVERVIEW

The WORLD CAT 325 CC is a motor catamaran built with a fiberglass and plastic hull. Offered by Andrey Shestakov of Shestakov Yacht Sales, it combines confident on water performance with compact, practical proportions for a variety of boating activities.

Selecting a [325 CC](#)

If your goal is a stable motor yacht that benefits from catamaran stability, the 325 CC warrants consideration. Powered by twin Yamaha outboards, it posts a cruising speed of 28.3 kn (32.57 mph) and can reach a top speed of 52.2 kn (60.07 mph). A generous 10 ft (3.2 m) beam and a shallow minimum draft of 4.374 ft (1.3333 m) enhance both onboard comfort and access to shallow waters. 28.3 kn (32.57 mph) and a **maximum speed** of 52.2 kn (60.07 mph).

Q: What are the key **dimensions** and **draft** ? A: Overall length is 32 ft (9.75 m), the beam is 10 ft (3.2 m), and the minimum draft measures 4.374 ft (1.3333 m).

Owner Experience Review

Owners select the WORLD CAT 325 CC for a broad spectrum of boating missions: offshore sportfishing and tournament days, leisurely sandbar gatherings with family, and entertaining over a weekend. The wide beam that runs aft pays dividends in usable deck area. Bow and cockpit seating flip easily between lounging and fishing configurations, there's significant insulated fish box storage, a 45 gallon livewell, dedicated tackle stowage, and removable coolers—features that let owners convert the layout quickly for serious angling or social cruising.

On the water, owners and walk through reviewers regularly note a drier, gentler ride through chop versus many monohulls, with one owner remarking, "The ride and stability are insane." Offshore handling is steady and reassuring, and range and fuel efficiency are considered strong for a 32 foot center console catamaran. As with most boats, performance depends on the propulsion package; a factory bulletin citing twin Yamaha F350s reports a typical cruise around 19.5 mph and a wide open throttle near 57.9 mph. Helm ergonomics and electronics packages earn praise—many examples are fitted with dual Garmin displays and a comfortable leaning post/tackle center. The console's electric flush head is convenient for day outings, though private, enclosed overnight accommodations are limited compared with dual console or cabin designs. Maintenance reports are favorable; a 2024 owner with twin

Mercury 300 V8s described the engines as “flawless” after a 300 hour service. Owner manuals stress routine care: saltwater engine flushes, changing sacrificial anodes, checking livewell/raw water and bilge pumps, managing batteries, and periodically inspecting O rings and fuel pickup parts. Aft access to electrical runs and bilge areas is straightforward, which simplifies many service tasks.

Pros and Cons

- Exceptionally smooth, stable, and dry ride offshore; owners have called the ride and stability “insane.”
- Big, versatile deck with convertible bow/cockpit seating, removable coolers, and ample insulated fish boxes.
- Confident offshore handling with good range and fuel economy for a 32' center console cat.
- Enclosed accommodations are limited; the electric flush head suits day trips more than overnighting.
- Routine upkeep in saltwater includes engine flushes, anode replacement, and regular pump and battery checks.
- Performance varies by engine package; a Yamaha F350 bulletin shows ~19.5 mph cruise and ~57.9 mph WOT, so verify with your setup.
