Q: What type of yacht is the 36 Offshore? A: The 36 Offshore is configured as a motor yacht built on a center console configuration with a fiberglass and plastic hull. Its defining features are **open-deck access** and **360° fishability** that center-console owners rely on.

Q: Who builds the 36 Offshore? A: This model is manufactured by YELLOWFIN.

Buyers can expect the **build quality** and **brand pedigree** associated with the builder's reputation in this sector.

Q: What are the primary dimensions? A: The boat's principal measurements are **LOA** 36 ft (10.97 m), **beam** 10 ft (3.05 m), and **max draft** 5.468 ft (1.6666 m), giving it a footprint well-suited to offshore work.

Owner Experience Review

Owners frequently run the 36 Offshore hard in offshore tournament conditions, then repurpose the same platform for family outings to sandbars on the weekend. The boat's layout accommodates both roles: large livewells and coffin box storage for lengthy runs, convertible forward seating that becomes lounging space, and a stand up head built into the console that enables short overnight stays. The helm is designed to accept large multifunction screens and can even be arranged with an upper station for bait spotting, while the cockpit remains open and optimized for fishing with numerous lockers.

On the water, owners consistently praise the twin step hull for providing a dry ride and excellent chop control while maintaining efficient balance. The boat planes quickly and produces considerable top end speed; published runs report roughly 60–62 mph with triple 300–350+ outboards, and those outfitted with triple 400s report similarly high speed performance. Most operators

choose a conservative midrange cruise, finding comfortable fuel economy around 30–32 mph and sufficient range for typical day trip offshore missions.

Practical ownership notes are common: a number of boats were originally delivered with Evinrude E-TEC G2 engines, and BRP's 2020 discontinuation of those lines has reduced factory support and parts availability in some areas. Routine maintenance items typically include water pump impeller replacement, trim/tilt servicing, and general outboard upkeep. Service access is generally well thought out — the console and forepeak provide points for electronics and chain locker servicing, battery banks sit under seats, and there are three clearly marked freshwater flush hose connections. On pre-owned examples, buyers should be aware of documented fuel tank replacements (for instance, all three tanks on a 2006 hull were replaced in 2019), so tank condition checks are a prudent part of any used boat inspection.

Pros and Cons

- Twin-step hull delivers a dry, chop-taming ride with balanced offshore efficiency.
- Quick to plane with strong top end; tests cite ~60–62 mph with triple 300–350+ and owners of triple 400s report similar high-speed feel.
- Versatile deck with big livewells, coffin box, forward loungers, and a stand-up head suits fishing and family days.
- Many boats with Evinrude E-TEC G2 power face thinner factory support since production ended in 2020.
- Older examples have documented fuel tank replacements, so tank condition merits inspection on used boats.
- Routine outboard upkeep—impellers, trim/tilt work, and engine flushing—remains a recurring ownership task.
