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OVERVIEW

SEASCAPE V presents an uncommon opportunity to acquire one of Benetti's most esteemed semi-custom motor yachts. As Hull No. 5 of the celebrated Vision 145 series, she embodies the defining qualities that established this line as a benchmark for the Italian yard: timeless exterior lines by Stefano Righini, elegantly appointed interiors by François Zuretti, exceptional internal volume and genuine long-range cruising capability. Offering 443 gross tons of accommodation, five beautifully finished guest suites for up to ten guests, dedicated crew quarters for eight and a cruising range approaching 6,000 nautical miles, she provides the levels of comfort, capability and practicality typically associated with much larger displacement vessels.

Originally commissioned by a seasoned yachtsman who refined the specification after chartering Hull No. 1, SEASCAPE V benefits from a succession of owner-driven enhancements and meticulous care. Her lifecycle improvements include a comprehensive interior renewal under François Zuretti's direction, significant upgrades to bridge electronics and communications, rebuilt Northern Lights generators, the successful completion of the 25-Year Lloyd's Class Survey, and the addition of Naiad Zero Speed stabilizers in January 2026. Each upgrade has modernized her systems and onboard technology while respecting the enduring design language and robust engineering that define the Vision 145 platform.

Propelled by twin Caterpillar 3508B diesels and supported by world-class equipment suppliers, SEASCAPE V has been maintained to Lloyd's Class standards, delivering a rare combination of pedigree, engineering integrity and operational confidence. Her expansive interior salons, signature Winter Garden, private owner's terrace, chef-ready galley and numerous open-air social areas create an onboard environment equally suited to relaxed family cruising, refined entertaining or extended international passages. For buyers

seeking a world-class luxury superyacht that marries elegance, reliability and lasting ownership value, SEASCAPE V stands among the most compelling Vision 145 examples currently offered.

DETAILED DESCRIPTION

Recent upgrades and improvements

Under her present ownership, SEASCAPE V has benefited from a meticulous program of mechanical, technical and cosmetic enhancements conceived to increase reliability, bring onboard systems into the modern era and safeguard the yacht's long-term value. Substantial investments have been directed to major generator overhaul, navigation electronics, communications, lighting, interior refinements and wider engineering upgrades. The most notable enhancement was the January 2026 Naiad Zero Speed Stabilizer retrofit, which incorporated Zero Speed technology into the existing Naiad system to deliver markedly improved comfort at anchor while seamlessly complementing the vessel's already effective underway stabilization. These upgrades have been accompanied by a disciplined regime of mechanical servicing and preventative maintenance. Together with the successful completion of the twenty-five-year Lloyd's Class survey, these works make SEASCAPE V one of the most comprehensively updated Benetti Vision 145s on the market.

Since 2023 the yacht's machinery and engineering program has seen the professional rebuild of the twin Northern Lights 110 kW generators and a thorough programme of engine room maintenance. All mechanical systems are maintained to Lloyd's Class standards, with continual preventative care applied across propulsion and auxiliary systems to ensure dependable operation.

The bridge has been modernised with the installation of three 22-inch Furuno multifunction displays as part of an upgraded navigation suite, improving operational capability and expanding the vessel's digital monitoring and bridge systems. Communications and connectivity have been transformed by the addition of Starlink high-speed satellite internet and a new WiFi 6 wireless

network, providing markedly enhanced onboard connectivity for guests and crew alike.

On the security front a new 4K HD camera monitoring and security system has been fitted, together with upgraded vessel monitoring solutions for more comprehensive onboard surveillance. The interior received a tasteful refresh by François Zuretti / Zuretti Design in 2022, introducing updated soft furnishings and new HD televisions throughout; original Zuretti materials have been retained onboard to facilitate future servicing and repairs, while horizontal interior surfaces are protected with satin and gloss films to preserve finishes.

Lighting throughout the yacht has been renewed with energy-efficient LED fixtures, complemented by new interior spot lighting, rope lighting, updated blackout solutions, new step lighting and dimmers integrated with an advanced lighting control system to create refined ambience and functionality. In classification and survey matters, the vessel completed her twenty-five-year Lloyd's Class Survey in 2025 and continues to be maintained in Lloyd's Class, reflecting a commitment to the highest standards of upkeep and compliance.

Ownership highlights

Guided by an ownership approach that prioritizes proactive, continuous investment in modernization rather than postponed upkeep, this yacht has benefited from an ongoing program of upgrades across its mechanical, electrical, navigation and interior systems. A reliable Caterpillar propulsion package, supported by worldwide service networks, provides trusted performance while rebuilt Northern Lights generators deliver steady, dependable onboard power. The helm has been refitted with updated bridge electronics and is complemented by a contemporary communications infrastructure that keeps guests and crew seamlessly connected. The addition of Naiad Zero Speed Stabilization elevates comfort at anchor, and collectively

these thoughtful enhancements place her among the most comprehensively updated Benetti Vision 145s available today.

Main salon

Occupying the full beam of the Vision 145, whose impressive 30'4" (9.26 m) width is fully expressed here, the main salon is an elegant synthesis of refined architectural provenance and relaxed, liveable luxury. Conceived by the internationally acclaimed François Zuretti and refreshed in 2022 under the guidance of Zuretti Design, the interior is finished in deep high-gloss wood paneling complemented by updated soft furnishings while selected original materials have been carefully preserved for future refurbishments. The open-plan layout is tailored for large-scale entertaining, and expansive panoramic side windows run nearly the salon's length to fill the space with abundant natural light and maintain unobstructed sightlines from seated positions.

Comfortable conversation areas are composed of multiple cream-colored sofas and coordinating upholstered armchairs gathered around a central coffee table, while a formal dining arrangement sits forward in the salon with upholstered chairs surrounding a dedicated dining table for refined service. For sophisticated hosting, a built-in wet bar—one of three fully equipped guest wet bars aboard SEASCAPE V—offers polished granite countertops, glass display shelving for premium spirits and stemware, and bespoke storage for barware. Entertainment is focused on a large mounted HD flat-screen television, and all televisions aboard have been upgraded to new HD displays to create a versatile environment for films, sporting events, presentations, or casual viewing.

Underfoot, continuous polished hardwood flooring extends the length of the salon, and recessed ceiling fixtures provide gentle ambient illumination while accent lighting has been integrated into the woodwork. The yacht-wide LED

system has been upgraded and augmented with new interior spot lighting and rope lighting throughout the interior, together with blackout safety lighting and enhanced interior step lighting for secure movement. New dimmers and lighting controllers have been fitted across the vessel to precisely adjust atmosphere at any hour. The refined interior is enlivened with modern artwork, decorative lamps and curated accessories that lend a residential warmth to the classic Zuretti vocabulary, and premium upholstered seating has been chosen for enduring comfort on long-range passages.

Air-conditioning vents are discreetly incorporated into the architecture to maintain a climate-controlled environment without interrupting the clean lines of the décor.

Onboard systems have been modernized to match the salon's aesthetic, including new WiFi 6 access points for improved connectivity, Starlink internet for high-speed communications throughout the yacht, and a new 4K HD camera system for comprehensive monitoring and security. Horizontal surfaces have been safeguarded with new satin and gloss protective film where appropriate, and the interior has been maintained in exceptional condition. Sliding glass doors open directly to the main aft deck, ensuring effortless indoor-outdoor flow for guests and easy circulation between the salon, dining area and adjacent living spaces. As one of three principal guest entertaining areas aboard, the main salon combines updated technology, enduring Zuretti styling and generous interior volume to form one of SEASCAPE V's most memorable living environments.

Formal dining room

Situated forward of the main salon, the formal dining room presents François Zuretti's interior architecture within one of the Vision 145's expansive full beam living areas, taking full advantage of the yacht's generous 443 GT interior volume. The space follows an open plan arrangement that promotes

effortless circulation across the main deck and a direct link to the salon, allowing a graceful flow from aperitifs to dinner and accommodating larger social events without interruption. Its close relationship to the galley facilitates discreet, efficient service, while broad circulation routes enable staff to attend to guests unobtrusively during formal functions. Warm, high gloss wood panelling and a polished hardwood sole envelop a bespoke dining table that serves as the room's focal point, surrounded by contemporary upholstered chairs with wooden frames that seat up to ten guests. Oversized panoramic side windows bathe the cabin in natural light and afford sweeping exterior views while dining, and the refined ceiling treatment conceived by Zuretti, together with recessed overhead lighting, casts a soft, inviting glow. Accent luminaires have been positioned to showcase the fine wood joinery, and the interior lighting scheme was recently enhanced with upgraded LED fixtures, new dimmers and centralized lighting controllers installed throughout the yacht to precisely set the atmosphere. Comfort is assured by the central air conditioning system, and the décor's classic sensibility intentionally steers clear of transient trends to provide an elegant backdrop for owner entertaining, family dining or charter guests. This main deck dining salon is complemented by a second formal option in the bridge deck Winter Garden, broadening the possibilities for sophisticated onboard gatherings.

Owner's stateroom

Positioned forward on the main deck, the full-beam owner's suite conceived by François Zuretti offers an exceptional level of privacy and is widely acknowledged as one of the premier master cabins on any yacht under 500 GT. The 2022 interior refresh, carried out under the supervision of Zuretti Design, further refined the space with sumptuous high-gloss wood paneling and upgraded soft furnishings introduced during that program. At its heart sits a king-size centerline berth crowned by a custom upholstered headboard and

flanked by integrated bedside cabinetry, while abundant drawer space, extensive hanging lockers and built-in storage throughout make organization effortless. Individual climate control, an integrated entertainment system and a built-in flat-screen HD television enhance the tranquil atmosphere, and all televisions aboard were replaced with new HD displays for a uniform, contemporary media experience.

A wraparound sweep of 180-degree panoramic windows bathes the suite in natural light from three aspects, delivering sweeping forward and lateral views whether underway or at anchor, with bespoke window treatments providing both privacy and exacting control over daylight. A generous lounge seating area establishes a secluded retreat, and the suite provides direct access to the owner's private study and ensuite bath, as well as exclusive entry to the private bow terrace. Carefully separated from guest accommodations and benefiting from excellent acoustic isolation from the machinery spaces, the stateroom affords quiet comfort on passage and at rest. Realized on the yacht's 443 GT platform, the residential proportions of the suite reflect its purpose as a vessel intended for extended cruising and full-time ownership and incorporate the discerning customizations requested by the original owner after years aboard Hull No. 1. This owner's suite remains one of SEASCAPE V's most notable competitive advantages in the 140–150 foot segment and stands as a defining element that sets the Vision 145 series apart from other fiberglass tri-deck motor yachts.

Owner's private study

Conceived as a secluded study within the owner's suite, this private retreat forms part of the owner's apartment and is reached exclusively from the owner's living quarters, with direct access to the sleeping cabin and close proximity to the ensuite bath. Tucked away from guest circulation, the room offers true residential proportions rarely found on yachts of this size and bears

the refined signature of François Zuretti in its interior design. The space is appointed with mirror-finished high-gloss wood joinery and plush premium carpeting, while expansive panoramic side windows flood the room with natural daylight and afford clear exterior views even when seated. Luxurious upholstered seating and a bespoke executive desk create a sophisticated work environment, and purpose-built joinery provides orderly office cabinetry, dedicated storage for documents and personal effects, and integrated drawer compartments.

Technology and mood are equally considered: a flat-screen HD television is paired with an integrated entertainment system, and every television aboard has been upgraded to the latest HD displays. Decorative overhead fixtures are complemented by comprehensive LED lighting upgrades throughout the yacht, all controlled via new dimmers and lighting controls, and independent climate control guarantees comfort in every season. The result is a versatile sanctuary—an efficient workspace for remote business, an intimate reading room or private library—specifically intended to support extended cruising and long-term ownership. For owners who work while traveling, this feature significantly enhances both the functionality and privacy of the Vision 145 owner's suite.

Owner's ensuite & private forward terrace

Dedicated exclusively to the owner, the ensuite bath offers residential-scale comfort highlighted by a full-size Jacuzzi soaking tub and a separate enclosed shower. A dual his-and-her vanity is set beneath premium stone countertops and fitted with polished chrome fittings, while large framed mirrors reflect the space's generous proportions. High-gloss wood cabinetry provides an abundance of drawers and cupboards plus a dedicated linen locker, and stone underfoot together with carefully layered decorative lighting create a refined ambiance enlivened by excellent natural light. The plan accommodates two

people with ease, the finish is seamlessly in keeping with the yacht's François Zuretti interior, and every element has been specified for extended owner use rather than occasional weekend stays.

Directly beyond the suite, a private forward terrace—accessible only through the owner's stateroom—serves as one of the Benetti Vision 145's most distinctive appointments and a rare bow-level retreat reserved at the owner's discretion. A centerline automatic sliding door opens to uninterrupted forward-facing vistas and an elevated perspective whether underway or at anchor. The deck features generous built-in seating and space for an exterior dining or cocktail table set upon bespoke teak decking, all safeguarded by stainless-steel safety rails. Separated from the main guest entertainment areas to ensure exceptional privacy, the terrace provides a tranquil spot for morning coffee or evening cocktails and operates as a direct, indoor-outdoor extension of the owner's living quarters. As one of the uncommon owner amenities in a semi-custom yacht of this size, it stands as a defining architectural signature of the Vision 145 and a clear advantage over comparable 140–150 foot vessels.

VIP stateroom

This full-beam VIP guest suite, positioned on the lower deck to ensure privacy and quiet operation, was conceived by François Zuretti and finished with sumptuous high gloss wood joinery and richly upholstered wall treatments. A centerline queen berth, crowned by a bespoke upholstered headboard, is flanked by built-in bedside cabinets with concealed storage and dedicated reading lights on both sides; large hull-side portlights bathe the cabin in natural light and frame sweeping ocean views from the bed while bespoke window treatments allow complete privacy. Entertainment is effortless with a flat-screen HD television linked to an integrated entertainment system, and every television aboard has been upgraded to new HD displays. Ample storage is incorporated throughout, including a built-in wardrobe with hanging

capacity, a generous chest of drawers and additional cabinet lockers designed to accommodate extended cruising. A vanity that doubles as a writing desk and an inviting lounge chair provide private retreats, and the cabin's ambiance is elevated by premium carpeting, independent climate controls, recessed LED overhead lighting, subtle accent illumination built into the joinery and an ornamental ceiling treatment. The privately accessed ensuite features a stone vanity countertop with wood vanity cabinetry, a separate enclosed shower, premium plumbing fixtures, a backlit mirror and stone flooring. Superior sound insulation from the guest corridors preserves tranquillity, and the suite is deliberately appointed for prolonged stays—comparable in size and creature comfort to many owner's staterooms—and finished throughout with the same materials and craftsmanship that define SEASCAPE V.

Guest staterooms

Configured with five staterooms to sleep up to ten guests, the accommodation plan places four guest cabins on the lower deck, quietly separated from the owner's suite while retaining direct access to the main guest foyer. The layout offers a tasteful mix of queen and twin berths, with twin cabins designed to convert where required, providing flexible sleeping arrangements for private ownership or charter use, and every guest cabin benefits from its own ensuite and a consistent level of finish throughout.

François Zuretti's interior language permeates each cabin, expressed through lustrous high-gloss wood joinery, sumptuous upholstered headboards and mattresses specified for long-stay comfort. Bespoke bedside tables and reading lamps flank every berth, and ample storage is provided via hanging lockers, deep drawers suitable for extended cruising and additional built-in cabinetry. Underfoot, premium carpeting complements recessed LED ceiling lights, integrated accent lighting within the joinery and refined ceiling detailing, creating a warm, tailored atmosphere with a degree of privacy and spatial

generosity rarely found in the 140–150 foot segment.

Generous hull-side portlights admit natural daylight, softened by custom privacy blinds, while independent climate controls allow each guest to set personal comfort levels. Every stateroom is fitted with a flat-screen HD television—each unit recently upgraded to new HD displays—and a fully integrated entertainment system. The ensuites are comprehensively appointed with stone vanity tops, wood vanity cabinets, separate enclosed showers, high-end plumbing fixtures, stone flooring, mirrors with built-in illumination and dedicated towel storage.

Overall, the guest quarters emphasize Benetti's commitment to livability, comfort and enduring design, favoring refined, functional accommodation over a mere maximization of berth numbers.

Galley

Outfitted to commercial standards yet refined for a private yacht, the galley occupies the main deck to ensure smooth, efficient service with direct access to the formal dining room and thoughtfully routed crew circulation that minimizes any interruption to guests. A food lift (dumbwaiter) links the space to the bridge deck for swift, discreet delivery of meals, reflecting a layout conceived to excel whether the yacht is privately owned or operated for luxury charter.

The appliance specification is exceptional for a vessel in this category, featuring a Miele steam oven, a Miele conventional oven, a Miele convection oven, a Miele four-burner cooktop and a Miele integrated dishwasher. Cold storage is comprehensive with a Sub-Zero full-height refrigerator and a Sub-Zero full-height freezer, supplemented by additional refrigerated compartments. A built-in microwave and commercial-grade exhaust ventilation add professional capability, while a dedicated coffee preparation area, purposeful task lighting over all work zones, abundant natural light, and a climate-controlled working

environment ensure comfort and precision for every service. Together these components form an appliance package tailored to the demands of a professional yacht chef and to the rigors of extended cruising.

Preparation and provisioning are made effortless by premium stone countertops that offer expansive workspace, a stainless steel double sink, and an efficient work triangle designed to maximize meal preparation flow.

Extensive custom cabinetry provides generous drawer capacity, overhead storage and a dedicated pantry, delivering the storage volumes required for prolonged provisioning. A durable, easy-maintenance sole completes this carefully considered galley, where every detail has been honed for performance, reliability and seamless service.

Wheelhouse & captain's area

The raised professional wheelhouse serves as the yacht's operational heart, anchored by a full-width navigation console and a centerline helm station that together provide exceptional ergonomics and a commanding feel. Expansive bridge windows afford unobstructed forward visibility and clear sightlines to both port and starboard, while direct access to both bridge wings and exterior bridge wing controls for close-quarters maneuvering ensure assured handling in tight harbors. Companion seating beside the helm invites collaboration, and a dedicated navigation station—complete with chart storage and a built-in administrative workspace—supports meticulous passage planning. Immediate connectivity to the captain's accommodations and the convenient proximity of the bridge deck and skylounge streamline operations and enhance readiness.

A comprehensive electronic navigation suite integrates radar systems, GPS navigation, an electronic charting system, autopilot, a depth sounder, wind instrumentation, VHF communications, engine monitoring systems, bow thruster controls, stabilizer monitoring and controls, searchlight controls, alarm monitoring systems, and a magnetic compass. Generous overhead

lighting for night operations is complemented by red night-navigation lighting to preserve night vision, while individual climate controls and durable, low-glare bridge finishes promote comfort and concentration on extended passages. Designed for safe, comfortable long-range operation, this professional command center affirms the yacht's credentials as a true ocean-going motor yacht.

Crew accommodations

Purpose-built for professional operation, the crew quarters sleep up to eight crew members across four dedicated cabins that are deliberately arranged and segregated from guest areas to preserve privacy and discretion. A private crew entrance and a separate crew companionway, together with thoughtfully designed circulation routes, keep service movements out of guest sightlines while providing direct, efficient links to the galley, the engine room, exterior working decks and mooring stations, the bridge and other engineering spaces, as well as immediate access to onboard laundry facilities. This configuration promotes a smooth, unobtrusive workflow for all daily duties and tender operations.

Comfortable daily living is assured by a well-appointed crew mess that offers a designated dining and lounge environment alongside a fully equipped crew pantry, while each crew cabin features individual berths with personal privacy, ensuite bathrooms, individual climate controls and reading lights to enhance off-watch respite. Storage has been carefully considered with built-in hanging lockers, personal drawer space, overhead lockers and integrated cabinetry for orderly stowage, and premium marine flooring throughout combined with durable, commercial-grade finishes guarantee resilience under professional use. Generous ventilation and plentiful lighting complete the accommodation, creating an environment designed for long-term crew comfort and efficient vessel operation that supports both private ownership and charter service

while aiding retention during extended cruising.

Engine room

Beneath immaculate finishes, the propulsion suite is formed by twin Caterpillar 3508B diesel mains, each rated at 905 horsepower continuous, delivering the performance and efficiency to achieve an approximate 6,000-nautical-mile transoceanic range at economical cruise. This proven powertrain, supported by global service networks, is paired with a Naiad hydraulic stabilizer system to ensure steady, comfortable passages in all seaways.

Electrical resilience is provided by dual Northern Lights 110 kW generators, both rebuilt during the vessel's recent refit to restore prime condition; the two-generator arrangement preserves full electrical redundancy for extended voyaging. Close-quarters maneuvering is assisted by twin hydraulic bow thrusters, while twin watermakers sustain autonomy on long passages.

Systems engineered for prolonged, low-maintenance operation include fuel polishing, an onboard oil change system, duplex fuel filtration, a clearly labeled fuel manifold and sea strainers arranged for straightforward inspection and servicing. Habitability and safety are supported by a chilled-water air-conditioning plant, integrated fire detection and suppression, a comprehensive bilge monitoring network and an engineered ventilation scheme that ensures proper airflow and cooling throughout the machinery spaces.

The engine room has been configured for serviceability, offering generous standing headroom, wide access around both mains and excellent reach to generators and auxiliary units. Bright LED lighting, diamond-plate walkways for secure footing, neatly routed piping and cable runs and substantial sound insulation all contribute to a quiet, safe working environment, while a dedicated workbench and organized maintenance zones simplify routine servicing.

From the wheelhouse, fully integrated engine monitoring and alarm systems provide clear, centralized oversight, supporting confident owner-operator management with straightforward access for professional engineer servicing. Maintained to a high standard, the engineering layout embodies Benetti's focus on reliability, accessibility and long-term maintainability. The result is a robust machinery package ideally suited to serious long-range cruising and global operation, further enhanced by extensive mechanical maintenance and system upgrades carried out under the current ownership.

Aft deck and swim platform

The covered main aft deck opens directly into the formal salon through stainless-steel framed sliding glass doors, creating an effortless transition between interior and exterior living spaces. The deck and surrounding walkways are finished in expansive, custom teak with finely turned teak caprails and carefully executed transom detailing, while polished stainless-steel handrails and hardware provide a refined metallic accent. A built-in upholstered seating area anchors the aft, arranged around a bespoke exterior cocktail table and complemented by additional movable furnishings that allow quick reconfiguration for relaxed lounging or larger gatherings. Sheltered beneath the bridge deck overhang, this entertaining zone is fitted with integrated overhead lighting and marine-grade exterior speakers, making it an inviting place for morning coffee, evening cocktails or casual alfresco dining, with ample circulation for guests during social occasions. Generous side decks afford safe passage forward, with direct access to both port and starboard walkaround decks and straightforward return to the main salon, all while offering excellent sightlines down to the swim platform.

Broad teak staircases lead down to a full-width teak swim platform that functions as a prime staging area for watersports, perfectly suited to paddleboards, Seabobs and a variety of water toys, and serving as a practical

boarding point for tenders. Easy access to the water supports swimming and diving activities, enhanced by a freshwater shower for rinsing and a heavy-duty stainless-steel boarding ladder. The arrangement also provides a dedicated tender loading and guest boarding zone, safe and convenient when stern-to at the dock, plus an effective working area for line handling during docking, with integrated transom storage where applicable. Frequently among the yacht's most-used outdoor spaces, the aft deck and swim platform have been laid out to comfortably support intimate family cruising as well as the demands of luxury charter operations.

Bridge, navigation & electronics

A purpose-designed raised pilothouse provides the centerpiece for a navigation environment engineered for safe, long-range cruising, anchored by a full-width navigation console and a centerline helm flanked by companion helm seating. Ergonomics are refined and visibility is exceptional, with expansive forward bridge glazing and clear sightlines to both bridge wings, while exterior bridge wing docking stations afford precise control during close-quarters maneuvers. The deckhouse arrangement is organized around operational efficiency, featuring a dedicated navigation workstation, an administrative passage-planning area, dedicated chart storage and direct access to the captain's cabin, together with immediate entry to the skylounge and the bridge deck aft. Individual climate controls and low-glare finishes have been specified to ensure comfort and visibility during night operations.

The electronic navigation suite is comprehensive and professionally specified, including radar, GPS navigation, an electronic charting system, autopilot, depth sounder, wind instruments, VHF communications and a magnetic steering compass. Systems for operational oversight are equally thorough: Caterpillar engine monitoring, full vessel alarm monitoring, Naiad stabilizer monitoring and controls, complete electrical system surveillance, searchlight controls and

bow thruster controls provide precise handling and reassuring redundancy. Recent technology investments further elevate performance and connectivity, with three new 22-inch Furuno multifunction displays installed in 2023, a Starlink high-speed satellite internet installation, WiFi 6 access points distributed throughout the yacht and a new 4K HD camera system enhancing vessel security and monitoring. An upgraded onboard network infrastructure and integrated digital communications enable remote vessel management, while modernized bridge electronics improve navigational capability and operational efficiency. The ongoing program of bridge system upgrades reflects the current owner's commitment to maintaining the yacht to contemporary operational standards.

Tender garage & watersports

The teak-finished boat deck has been crafted to house a substantial primary tender, with a dedicated garage and a hydraulic tender crane that enables swift, reliable launching and recovery. The tender handling system is specified to professional standards, incorporating secure tie-down points and heavy-duty deck fittings, expansive working areas and continuous stainless-steel safety railings to ensure confident, safe operations. Crew move directly from service zones via intelligently planned circulation routes that limit any intrusion into guest areas, while sightlines for launch and retrieval are optimised so the functional layout supports rapid tender deployment. The overall deck arrangement is designed to maintain safe handling in a range of sea states, combining practical sophistication with operational efficiency.

Easy access to the swim platform turns this section into a natural staging area for diving and snorkeling, with dedicated lockers for watersports equipment, fenders and docking gear and ample room reserved for paddleboards, kayaks, Seabobs, inflatables and other water toys. When the tender is in the water, the freed deck area enhances circulation and versatility and provides direct,

convenient access from the bridge-deck entertaining spaces. This Benetti-designed arrangement, prioritising practicality and crew efficiency, is deliberately engineered to support extended cruising in remote destinations, creating an exceptional platform for family cruising, beach excursions and luxury charter experiences.

Bridge deck aft I upper salon

Expansive and gracefully sheltered, the bridge deck aft opens directly from the skylounge through stainless steel-framed sliding glass doors and provides immediate access to the Winter Garden dining area, establishing a seamless connection for refined indoor-outdoor living. The underfoot surface is a full teak deck set with traditional black caulking, finished with custom teak caprails and appointed throughout with premium stainless steel railings and hardware for a classic nautical expression. A generously proportioned custom teak dining table seats up to ten guests for alfresco dining, encircled by bespoke exterior dining chairs upholstered in premium marine fabrics, a built-in upholstered aft settee and additional loose lounge seating that can be arranged with versatile ease to suit entertaining or quiet relaxation. Sheltered by the substantial sundeck overhang for all day comfort, the area is equipped with integrated recessed overhead lighting and LED courtesy illumination that transition the space from daylight to evening, while marine grade exterior audio speakers provide an enhanced atmosphere. Service is effortless via the skylounge wet bar, circulation is unimpeded along broad side decks, and an exterior stair grants direct access to the sundeck. From this vantage the space offers excellent aft visibility underway, with elevated sightlines over the swim platform and surrounding anchorage—an ideal setting for sunset cocktails where comfortable dining is naturally protected from direct sun and airflow is maintained without excessive wind exposure. Ample in scale to host large gatherings, the bridge deck aft is an exemplary venue for owner entertaining

and is equally well suited to private cruising or charter operations, one of several purposefully designed exterior entertaining areas aboard that embody the yacht's integrated indoor-outdoor living philosophy and a harmonious balance of shade, panoramic views and easy accessibility.

Sundeck

The expansive full-beam sundeck crowns the yacht, offering elevated 360-degree panoramic views and establishing itself as a premier exterior entertaining environment. A substantial integrated Jacuzzi spa, fashioned in molded fiberglass and finished with perimeter seating, is surrounded by a dedicated sun pad for effortless relaxation, while an array of chaise lounges and a sheltered lounge area provide a refined balance of sun-soaked and shaded retreats throughout the day. Custom teak decking runs continuously beneath wide walkways that encircle every seating zone, promoting generous circulation and creating a comfortable observation vantage during passages with exceptional visibility while cruising. At the center of the social experience, a full-service wet bar is appointed with a granite countertop, stainless steel sink, refrigerator, ice maker, built-in barbecue grill, storage cabinetry beneath the bar and raised seating for guests. A purpose-designed alfresco dining table with premium exterior dining chairs accommodates up to eight guests, making it ideal for large gatherings, cocktail hours, alfresco meals or leisurely anchorage stays. Stainless steel safety railings, integrated LED deck lighting and courtesy lighting along the walkways enhance both ambiance and security, while a marine-grade exterior sound system complements every moment. Easily serviced from the bridge deck below, this intelligent use of deck volume delivers conveniences more commonly found on substantially larger custom yachts and is conceived to facilitate effortless entertaining while preserving spacious circulation and uninterrupted views in every direction.

Foredeck

An expansive foredeck finished in traditional quarter-sawn teak with black caulking presents a refined yet purposeful fore area, bordered by broad walkaround side decks that deliver secure passage from the aft deck. Polished, heavy-duty stainless steel handrails and raised bulwarks provide confidence underway while flush-mounted deck hatches preserve a clean, uncluttered silhouette. Forward, a built-in seating arrangement with custom-upholstered sun pads, premium exterior fabrics and marine-grade, weather-resistant cushions forms a sumptuous bow lounge offering panoramic forward vistas—an ideal spot for sunrises, sunsets and a tranquil retreat apart from the main entertainment spaces—while integrated stainless steel drink holders and generous deck dimensions encourage easy guest circulation and dedicated lounging when at anchor. Operationally, the foredeck is equipped for serious seamanship with heavy-duty mooring bollards, a pair of anchor windlasses and dual bow anchors feeding into integrated chain lockers, complemented by stainless steel fairleads and robust cleats; freshwater washdown connections and dedicated anchor control stations support efficient anchoring and maintenance. Thoughtfully positioned discreet deck lighting for nighttime work and courtesy illumination along the walkways enhance safety and atmosphere. The arrangement affords straightforward line handling during docking, outstanding sightlines for anchoring maneuvers and a layout that allows crew to operate independently of guest areas. Beautifully integrated into the yacht's classic Benetti profile, the foredeck marries substantial operational capability with an inviting, elegant guest environment.

Engine room & mechanical systems

At the core of SEASCAPE V reside twin Caterpillar 3508B turbocharged diesel mains, each rated for continuous duty at 905 HP (675 kW). Installed on a

twin-screw direct drive arrangement, this proven Caterpillar platform is supported by a global factory network and extensive parts availability, offering dependable performance for long-range passagemaking and an economical cruising envelope that yields roughly 6,000 nautical miles. The engine room itself is laid out for efficiency, with generous access to both outboard and inboard service points to simplify routine work and inspections.

Electrical independence is provided by a pair of Northern Lights 110 kW diesel generators, both professionally rebuilt during the current ownership to ensure redundant power for uninterrupted vessel operation. The installation was executed with maintenance accessibility in mind, and the worldwide presence of Northern Lights parts and service adds an additional layer of confidence when cruising afar.

Comfort and handling are refined by a Naiad hydraulic fin stabilizer system paired with a hydraulic bow thruster, delivering active underway stabilization and precise low-speed maneuvering for stressed-free docking in tight harbors. Freshwater autonomy is addressed through twin watermakers and substantial onboard storage, enabling extended itineraries with minimal reliance on shore facilities.

Fuel and lubrication systems have been engineered for reliability and straightforward servicing, featuring a fuel polishing arrangement, duplex fuel filtration and a clearly labeled fuel manifold. Engine-mounted primary and secondary filters combine with an integrated oil change system that serves both engines and generators, all arranged to reduce downtime and simplify servicing routines.

Climate control is managed via a chilled-water air conditioning plant with centralized HVAC distribution throughout the yacht. Raw-water sea strainers are positioned for easy inspection, seawater piping is neatly organized and service valves are readily accessible, reflecting an emphasis on practical, maintainable systems.

Safety systems are comprehensive, with a fixed engine room fire suppression installation supported by fire detection and alarm monitoring and automatic machinery-space protection. Bilge monitoring with high-water alarms and emergency shutdowns further safeguard the vessel's engineering spaces.

Electrical management is robust and intuitive, centered on a primary distribution system with generator synchronization capability, extensive engine monitoring and digital alarm systems. Vessel systems are observable from the wheelhouse, backed by dedicated battery charging infrastructure and clearly identified electrical panels to facilitate operation and troubleshooting.

The engineering layout exemplifies meticulous planning: generous standing headroom through much of the machinery space, a wide centerline service walkway, exceptional access around both Caterpillar mains and easy reach to the generators and auxiliary machinery. Bright LED lighting illuminates the compartment, diamond-plate service walkways provide safe footing, piping runs are organized, valves are clearly labeled, and wiring harnesses are professionally routed and color-coded to expedite diagnostics. Acoustic insulation reduces machinery noise transmission, a dedicated maintenance workspace supports efficient servicing, ventilation is excellent throughout, and the overall arrangement follows Benetti's rigorous engineering principles.

Significant recent investment reinforces the vessel's mechanical pedigree: the twin Northern Lights 110 kW generators have been rebuilt, the twenty-five-year Lloyd's Class Survey has been completed, and extensive machinery maintenance has been performed under current ownership. Updated LED illumination and systems maintained to Class standards leave the engine spaces in exceptionally clean, operationally ready condition, with ongoing investment focused on sustained reliability.

For the owner seeking long range confidence, this is an industry respected Caterpillar propulsion package backed by a worldwide dealer network that simplifies service nearly anywhere. Combined with Benetti's proven

engineering platform and excellent system accessibility, the redundant mechanical systems support serious bluewater cruising and reduce routine maintenance time, making the engineering arrangement equally well suited for discerning private ownership or commercial charter. The result is a professionally maintained, thoughtfully engineered machinery space that reflects the high standard of care lavished throughout SEASCAPE V.

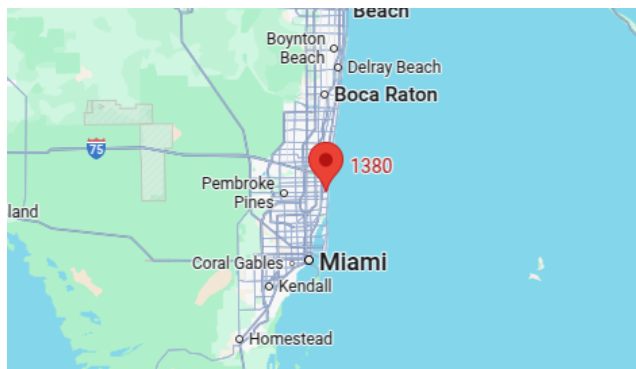
