OVERVIEW

1968 Century Coronado

This stunning vessel marks the last wooden Coronado produced by Century, a detail authenticated by the Century Club (see documentation at the end of the photo gallery). Largely preserved in its original form, the renowned 427/300 hp Ford Interceptor engine has been expertly rebuilt, with only about 20 hours logged since its refurbishment. The hour meter shows a total of 370 hours on the yacht, which is likely accurate. The interior has been elegantly updated, and both the varnish and bottom paint were renewed just last fall. When Century announced the cessation of their wooden boat production, Sierra Boat on Lake Tahoe was eager to purchase all remaining Coronados, provided they had hardtops. It seems Century had some leftover black hardtops from the 1965-67 production, as the 1968 model originally featured a tan hardtop to match the decks. This black hardtop is also confirmed as original by the Century Boat Club.

The yacht comes with a custom tandem axle trailer and a protective storage cover. Priced to reflect its rarity and superb condition, this is a rare opportunity for those seeking to purchase a yacht at the current boat location. Don't miss the chance to own this jewel in the yacht sales market!



DETAILED DESCRIPTION

Section name

This 1968 Century Coronado stands as a significant artifact of nautical heritage, marking the final wooden Coronado crafted by Century. Its genuineness is confirmed by the Century Club, with documentation available for inspection at the end of the photo gallery. The vessel is largely preserved in its original state, showcasing a carefully restored 427/300 hp Ford Interceptor engine, which has only 20 hours of use since its refurbishment. The hour meter reads a total of 370 hours, a number that is likely accurate given the boat's condition and history.
