OVERVIEW

The Bering BC60, a 60 ft / 18.9 m expedition power catamaran, is conceived for serious long-distance passagemaking, marrying purposeful engineering with the comforts of a luxury explorer. Built around a fully welded aluminum hull and superstructure, the BC60 offers the strength and longevity demanded by true bluewater voyaging while providing the composure and insulation of a twin-hulled platform.

Designed as an ocean-going motor catamaran, the yacht is a twin-screw, diesel-driven vessel fitted with fixed-pitch propellers to favor simplicity, reliability, and straightforward maintenance—qualities that translate into prolonged autonomy between ports. With calculated reserves and practical operating assumptions, including one generator running, the BC60 is capable of an extended range in excess of 3,000 nautical miles at an economical speed of approximately 7 knots, enabling confident offshore passages.

Propulsion is entrusted to 2 × Volvo Penta D8 450 hp main engines rated for continuous duty, a robust powertrain that pairs well with modern electrical systems. The ship's electrical architecture combines contemporary distribution and energy management with a Victron-based monitoring and alarm suite, delivering clear systems awareness, redundancy, and dependable operation when far from shore.

Below decks, versatile accommodation options scale from four to six cabins (optional), accommodating private family cruising, owner/operator exploration, or a premium charter program, all within the generous volume and stability that define a luxury power catamaran.



DETAILED DESCRIPTION

Bering Yachts BC60 is an expedition motor catamaran

The Bering Yachts BC60 is an expedition motor catamaran created for owners who want to buy a catamaran capable of cruising far beyond weekend horizons, a long-range, ocean-going concept built on a fully welded aluminum platform with practical offshore systems and a layout intended for real life on board; if you are searching for a catamaran for sale that fuses expedition capability with luxury comfort, the BC60 is positioned to deliver confidence in open water, efficiency at displacement speeds, and the kind of onboard autonomy experienced buyers expect when they decide to buy a yacht for serious cruising.

Performance and range

For buyers planning long passages, range leads the brief: the BC60 is specified with an economical long-range profile targeting 3,000+ nautical miles at 7 knots under defined operating assumptions, turning extended cruising routes into realistic itineraries while offering a cruising speed targeted around 10 knots and an estimated top speed up to roughly 14 knots pending final performance validation; this measured balance between efficient passage-making and practical speed makes the BC60 compelling for anyone seeking an expedition catamaran that can cross regions, not just coastlines.

Construction and offshore philosophy

The BC60 is conceived as an ocean-going motor catamaran built in fully welded aluminum, an approach favored by expedition yacht owners for durability,

serviceability, and long-term value, specified as a twin-screw diesel design with fixed-pitch propellers that emphasizes reliability and predictable handling offshore, and with project intent aligned to serious bluewater operation from day one to support buyers who want to buy a catamaran engineered with offshore priorities from the first page of the specification.

Deck layout, handling, and practical utility

An expedition catamaran for sale should be easy to live with at anchor and easy to manage at the dock, and the BC60 addresses both by specifying a hydraulic swim platform to simplify daily water access, tender operations, and toy handling, and including a dedicated yacht crane for practical deck logistics; mooring and anchoring equipment is defined with robust yacht-grade hardware and generous chain length allowances, enabling the kind of secure anchoring routine long-range cruising requires, a thoughtful deck engineering response for buyers who mean offshore use rather than just marina life.

Propulsion, maneuvering, and control

Power is specified as twin Volvo Penta D8 450 HP engines configured for continuous duty, paired with marine gearboxes and an engineered driveline intended to support long operational hours and efficient cruise profiles, with propeller details highlighted to reduce noise and vibration and thus elevate comfort over extended passages; for close-quarters control, twin bow thrusters are specified to deliver confidence when docking in wind or current, because these maneuvering and driveline details shape the daily ownership experience as much as headline speed when comparing catamaran yachts for sale in this size range.

Systems engineering for expedition cruising

What separates an expedition catamaran from a typical cruising boat is often what you cannot see, and the BC60 goes deep into fundamentals owners care about: fuel transfer capability, professional-grade filtration, and system logic that underpins offshore readiness; domestic water is specified with pressurized delivery and dedicated hot water capacity designed for true liveaboard use, while exhaust silencing and service provisions are included to support quieter operation and transparent maintenance, details that help an owner feel confident buying a catamaran for long-distance cruising because reliability is engineered into the architecture, not added as an afterthought.

Electrical power, monitoring, and autonomy

A long-range catamaran for sale should offer modern power management and clear visibility into onboard systems, so the BC60 electrical concept includes twin generators and a monitoring and alarm philosophy based on well-known modern control architecture to support better situational awareness and more controlled offshore operation; the specification emphasizes an integrated approach to power generation, shore power integration, battery banks, and monitoring, exactly what buyers expect when they search for an expedition catamaran and plan to spend significant time away from dock infrastructure.

HVAC and all-season comfort

The BC60 is outlined as a year-round, world-cruising platform and climate control is specified accordingly: the HVAC concept centers on a chilled-water plant with fan coils to maintain comfort across warm, humid conditions and cooler seasons, with dedicated machinery space ventilation specified to stabilize engine room temperatures and support reliable operation; for buyers

who want to buy a yacht or buy a catamaran as a true traveling home, these comfort and ventilation decisions are not optional but the foundation of enjoyable time aboard.

Interior design, layout flexibility, and liveboard function

The BC60 is intended to offer a flexible accommodation plan with multiple cabin arrangements depending on owner goals, a versatility that makes the platform attractive for private family cruising, owner-operator usage, or a guest-forward configuration tailored to your program; interior materials and equipment selections prioritize modern durability and comfort, with practical storage, clean finishes, and everyday usability, heads specified with premium fixtures and easy-maintenance surfaces, and a galley described to support real cooking, real provisioning, and real time on board — precisely what many buyers want when they search for a catamaran for sale to serve as a primary cruising yacht rather than an occasional getaway.

Safety and offshore readiness
