OVERVIEW

MY Piccolino, a 2019 Ferretti 780, is a distinguished offering from the celebrated Ferretti yard, stretching 24.01 metres and blending refined Italian lines with the assured vigor of a premium flybridge vessel. Born from the vision of Zuccon International Project, she rides on a GRP hull and superstructure crowned by a beautifully finished teak deck, while naval architecture by the Ferretti Engineering Department provides a robust, advanced planing platform that balances performance with seakeeping and comfort.

Beneath her elegant silhouette lie powerful MAN diesel engines that deliver spirited capability: a 30-knot top speed and a comfortable 24-knot cruising pace, with a practical range of about 380 nautical miles for effortless coastal journeys. Ride comfort and onboard serenity are enhanced by a Seakeeper gyro and Humphree Zero Speed fin stabilizers, ensuring steadiness both underway and at anchor. Adventures begin the moment you step off the transom: a Williams SportJet 395 tender is included, and paddleboards add leisurely options for days at anchor.

The exterior is conceived for living by the sea. The aft deck transforms into a chic beach club that dissolves the boundary between boat and water, while an expansive flybridge invites alfresco entertaining with freestanding furniture in both the aft and central zones, generous lounge seating, and a wet bar and grill situated aft of the fully equipped helm beneath a hardtop with glass center panels.

Interior accommodation welcomes up to eight guests across four elegant staterooms, appointed with meticulous detail, while separate crew quarters for up to three — a captain's cabin plus a twin crew cabin — ensure discreet, professional service. With 54 GT of volume and a generous 5.8-metre beam, Piccolino offers airy interiors and ample social spaces, marrying thoughtful engineering and refined design to create a smooth, confident ride for both day

trips and longer escapes in true superyacht style.

DETAILED DESCRIPTION

Custom

Crafted for connoisseurs who demand space, serenity, and seamless performance, this Ferretti 780 presents one of the most compelling offerings on the market, further distinguished by very low engine hours at 710. Her exterior lines are sleek and aerodynamic, with sharp contours that visually connect the main deck to the flybridge, while extensive glazed surfaces along the hull saturate the interior with natural light and deliver sweeping sea views. The lowered superstructure underscores a streamlined silhouette reminiscent of larger Ferretti yachts, and the brand's signature triple-porthole motif pays homage to a storied heritage. Built in durable fiberglass and refined with meticulous detailing throughout, she balances elegance and strength, and her spacious flybridge and inviting aft beach club underscore a design philosophy that champions outdoor living without compromise. Additional Humphree zero-speed electric fin stabilizers installed in 2023, working in concert with installed Seakeeper gyros, create remarkable poise both underway and at anchor, while the versatile flybridge layout—with a central bar, broad sun loungers and poufs, and the option of a hardtop with an adjustable sunshade—caters effortlessly to changing light, weather, and mood.

The accommodations are curated for effortless privacy and indulgent comfort. The full-beam master suite awaits to starboard on the lower deck, where large portholes bathe the space in daylight and frame captivating horizons. A centrally positioned double bed faces a wall-mounted TV, and a cozy daybed sits along the broadside beneath the porthole for lingering over the view. To port, a refined vanity that doubles as an office desk pairs with a compact cabinet, mirror, and bookshelf to elevate both style and functionality. The en-suite bathroom continues the sense of sanctuary with a separate shower

and his-and-hers sinks, while a generous starboard-side closet ensures ample storage. Finishes of matte light wood contrast gracefully with darker varnished furniture, set over a soft, smooth carpet that adds warmth underfoot. Forward on the lower deck, the VIP cabin is a spacious retreat with ceiling height of over 2 meters; its double bed is thoughtfully positioned for comfort and convenience, panoramic portholes usher in the light, and an innovative storage column provides abundant capacity while preserving the purity of the design. Two additional guest cabins, one to each side on the lower deck, offer practical, cozy layouts with twin beds, private en-suite bathrooms, and plentiful storage. In the stern, the crew quarters deliver both discretion and efficiency, with two cabins—one for the captain and another for crew—each featuring twin beds and en-suite bathrooms; the configuration accommodates up to 3 crew members to ensure smooth service. In total, the yacht welcomes 8 guests across 4 cabins, attended by a professional crew of 3.

The main salon is a celebration of light and continuity. Entering through sliding glass doors, you are greeted by an open-plan expanse where the former glass partitions between the exterior cockpit and salon have been removed to heighten the sense of space and merge indoor and outdoor living. To starboard, an L-shaped sofa with coffee table creates a sociable lounge that naturally flows to a dining table for eight, ideal for elegant dinners or relaxed family gatherings. Along the port side, a run of cabinetry conceals generous storage and a retractable TV, integrating technology with discretion. The aesthetic is defined by matte light wood on the walls, plush furnishings upholstered in fresh, perforated fabrics that remain comfortable even after sunbathing, and modern lighting that evokes the gentle cadence of waves. For an even more expansive feel, a bulkhead can be removed to connect the salon directly to the galley, further enhancing the open-plan atmosphere.

Purpose-built for both efficiency and hospitality, the U-shaped galley features a twin-door refrigerator, a built-in oven, ample counter space, and carefully arranged cabinetry that keeps tools and ingredients at hand. The layout

optimizes workflow and makes transitioning from food preparation to service seamless, whether for a casual lunch or a larger event in the dining area just steps away.

Forward on the main deck, the wheelhouse showcases innovation with a human touch. Excellent visibility inspires confident piloting, while advanced instrumentation—multifunction touch displays that integrate navigation systems, radar, chartplotter, GPS, and engine data—places mastery at the captain's fingertips. The ergonomic helm keeps every essential control within easy reach, and a comfortable pilot's chair complements the dual helm setup. While the throttle position may call for standing during certain adjustments, visibility and control remain paramount. The fully electronic steering is customizable, allowing the pilot to choose a softer or more responsive feel as conditions and preferences evolve. Direct access to both the flybridge and main deck ensures fluid movement across command spaces.

On deck, every zone is shaped for both relaxation and safe circulation. The foredeck invites conversation and repose with U-shaped seating around a central table and a generous forward sunpad for basking underway or at anchor; high bulwarks and sturdy railings deliver reassuring security. The main deck aft offers a broad cockpit dining area furnished with free-standing chairs over elegant, hardwearing teak, connected to the salon by large glass doors for effortless flow. From here, wide sidewalks extend along both sides of the yacht to the bow, with well-protected walkways and solid railings leading to steps that rise to the foredeck. Aft, the stern reveals an innovative beach club where a hydraulic lifting platform lowers to create an expansive sunbed at the water's edge. It's a serene haven for unwinding and a practical launch for swims and water toys, with storage compartments flanking the platform stairs—perfect for equipment such as Seabobs—and the option to rig an awning for shade. Movement around the yacht is enhanced by widened side decks, preserving both elegance and practicality. Above, the flybridge grants panoramic vistas and abundant lounging, centered on a substantial dining area served by a fully

equipped bar, while the forward secondary helm offers excellent sightlines and advanced instrumentation. An optional hardtop with extendable sunshade fine-tunes comfort in bright or variable conditions.

Underpinning this poise is a build that marries luxury with performance. The Ferretti Yachts 780, powered by twin MAN engines, achieves speeds up to 31 knots with the 1,550 mph option, while maintaining efficiency and a range of approximately 380 nautical miles at top speed. Special equipment includes optional fin or gyro stabilizers, the integrated Naviop-Simrad LOOP navigation system, a Dynamic Positioning System (DPS), and a joystick maneuvering system for precise, confident handling. Reinforcing peace of mind, a MAN Gold Package refit has been completed, and all batteries and pumps have been serviced and are ready for the season. Together with panoramic glazing that floods the interior, the submersible swim platform that transforms the stern into a private beach, and a customizable flybridge centered around a convivial bar, these attributes confirm this yacht as one of the best Ferretti 780 offerings available today.
