VESSEL WALK THROUGH

Vessel can be entered from opening sections in rail Port, Starbd, or Aft. Decks are wide and easy to walk around with large deck space fore and aft.

Pilot house is entered from Port side through opening door. The Pilot House has a warm feel with stained interior woodwork and white overhead slatted ceiling. There are 3 opening windows, 2 opening ports plus doors to the side and aft for excellent ventilation – large windows allow for 360 degree visibility from the inside helm, or seating areas.

A stairway leads down to the Salon/Galley – Galley is immediately to Port as you descend into the Salon with the Salon forward. There are numerous storage areas and a large Boatswain's locker forward of the Salon, and access to the chain locker forward of the Boatswain's locker.

Moving Aft along the Starbd Companionway are several large lockers for storage and also a hanging locker. There is access to the head (which is amidships) through the companionway

and this door allows for the head to be used as a day head. There are also 3 opening doors to the engine room

The master cabin is full beam and spans the entire aft section of the vessel. It is large and spacious with opening ports and overhead hatch. A queen berth is on the centerline with storage lockers to both sides. A separate stall shower is accessed from the aft cabin to Port side.

A parquet wood floor extends throughout the lower level of the boat and the side woodwork is finished in a combination of varnished woodwork and white painted uppers and overheads in the Classic Hereshoff style

SALON and GALLEY

Salon: Salon is very traditional and finished in the Classic Hereshoff style. There is finished woodwork and painted white overheads and hull woodwork. A large overhead butterfly hatch provides light and ventilation, plus 4 opening bronze port holes. Forward of the Salon is a large Boatswain's locker for storage, including sliding drawers, and access to the chain locker through this compartment.

Deep tufted seats are to Port and Starbd, with a wood table between for inside dining – and 23" by 48" fixed teak table w/fiddles and brass column base for inside dining (seats 4). There are numerous storage lockers lining both sides of the hull, and cabinets – Forward bulkhead serves as a storage wall for books etc. Built in end tables to Port & Starbd w/ marble tops and brass fiddles

There are beautiful backlit cut leaded glass doors on liquor and dish storage cabinets with 3 drawers and 4 cabinet doors beneath, which add to the period decor – Also, bookshelves Port & Starbd w/indirect lighting.

Lighted desk/work bench with storage lockers above in the starbd companionway - Engine access doors opposite. (3 opening or removable doors)

Teak Parquet floor throughout with 10 sole hatches for access to bilge & storage areas

Wet hanging locker – Starbd amidships

Water storage tanks under Salon settees and under Galley floor

Overhead lights

Emergency tiller stored behind Salon Settee

Galley: the Galley is immediately to Port as you descend the stairs from the Pilot House. There is ample work area with marble counter tops and retractable cutting board

Spectra water maker – mounted under sink

SS Double sink with pressurized water plus Fresh and salt water foot pumps

Separate Isotherm refrigerator and Waeco freezer – over and under- front opening both run on AC or DC power (refrigerator new Aug 2014)

6 storage cabinets above counter top – 5 drawers in Galley plus counter access to large storage area in corners

HULL and DECK

Classic styled Pilot house ketch with trunk cabin house aft. This is a comfortable sailing yacht with wide side decks , huge open foredeck, large aft deck (all fiberglass w/ nonskid). There is also a seating area forward of the pilot house with storage, and a raised trunk cabin house aft of the pilothouse (both with traditional teak to enhance the classic look of the vessel) in Keeping with the traditional look – the boat is surrounded by teak handrails and teak cap rail.

Vessel has gloss white tongue & grooved bulkheads & overhead with full teak louver & solid doors, drawers, corner posts, ceiling beams and trim – All exposed interior hull areas, including inside lockers, are fully lined with teak staving – All fixtures and ports are solid brass

Full keel w/ lead ballast embedded in fiberglass mat and glassed in

CONSTRUCTION:

CONSTRUCTION: Hull is solid hand laminated fiberglass w/alternating layers of mat & roving. Decks are sandwich-core construction with end grain balsa core for strength and insulation. Original teak decking has been removed – the deck sealed, and fiberglassed over and non-skid painted for durability. Teak overlay has been left on Carriage deck to carry the nostalgic theme – this deck has been serviced with new screws set in epoxy, and re-bunged (Aug 2014).

Chain plates and metal backing plates for cleats and winches are glassed in

Boat is all fiberglass construction with wood slating on Pilot House for the period theme – Pilot house roof is fiberglass

All through hulls are lever type bronze seacocks with wire bonding

There is a full teak rubrail on both sides with bronze face plate.

Bottom was painted prepped March 2014 -cleaned, filled, then 2 coats of epoxy/Interlux 2000 barrier coat, and 2 coats Petit 60 ablative bottom paint
