Main Salon

Fit and finish of any Hinckley built in this era. Satin finish American cherry, high end robust hardware and accessible storage not found in other boats.

Open and bright with galley up aft to port, lower helm forward to starboard with side deck door.

Oversize elevated setee aft to starboard converts to a berth with storage under. Dry bar cabinet in starboard aft corner of the saloon.

Custom cabinet forward (behind the helm) with 4 drawers (facing inboard), counter high shelf.

- Additional outboard locker with shelf and drop down panel. Counter high bookshelf aft with locker. L-shaped settee to port with large cherry drop leaf table with center storage and two drawers on the end. Two drawers under the settee plus two additional storage bins.

Flybridge

Enclosed bridge with removable aft curtain and port and starboard seating. Bridge extends aft of the closed section with room for seating, liferaft storage and mast. Mast (drops down) and boom for steadying sail. 18'6" air draft with the hinged mast and antennas down. Relocating the sat tv and radar antennas to the mast and removing the F/B arch would reduce the clearance to 16'8".
